# St. Francis of Assisi Parish History

On March 30, 1910, two Irish priests arrived in Bend, Oregon, but only Fr. Luke Sheehan remained, traveling by horse to visit his parishioners. The first church building was an old schoolhouse purchased in 1912 for \$75. Population growth necessitated a larger church; thus, the foundation stone for St. Francis of Assisi was laid on January 25, 1920, and it was opened and dedicated that same year (E. P. Brosterhous constructed the \$55,000 church). In addition, Fr. Sheehan asked nuns from the Order of St. Joseph to start a hospital, which later became St. Charles Hospital.

The Catholic School was started in 1936, with an enrollment of 140 students. The rectory was built in 1949, and is still in use today. In 1959, the nuns opened their own convent across the street from the church. As the number of parishioners increased, additional school and office space was needed. In July, 1992, 17 acres on 27th Street were purchased for \$300,000; and in July, 1995, an outdoor Mass celebrated the initial ground-breaking.

Construction of a school, offices, and community center began in 1997, with facilities officially opening in January 2000. The former school in downtown Bend was sold to McMenamins, which converted the school into a restaurant/hotel complex.

In 2006, the Franciscan Capuchins could no longer staff the parish, and Diocesan priests were assigned. Continued population growth prompted the building of a new church adjacent to the school. Official dedication of the St. Francis of Assisi Church was held on August 23, 2009. The 100th Anniversary of the Historic Church was celebrated in October 2020.

Access Ministry: A Ministry to help parishioners of any age with any kind of disability to become more involved in St. Francis Parish life—including serving at Mass, volunteering at Church events, or participating in Church programs. This Ministry pairs people with and without disabilities to learn from each other so that the gifts and talents of all parishioners are recognized and utilized. Acolytes: Any adult Catholic man in good standing with the Church can be an acolyte. It is a minor order conferred by the Bishop. All priests and deacons receive this order during the years of their theological formation. The acolytes' proper function is to serve at the altar and helping the priest and deacon at liturgical functions. Acolytes also set the altar for the liturgy of the Eucharist and assist in the distribution of Communion. Acolytes can expose the Blessed Sacrament for Eucharistic Adoration and repose the Blessed Sacrament when Adoration is completed. Training is provided, and ministers may schedule based on their availability.

**Altar Servers:** Altar servers help the priest in all liturgical functions and are an essential part of the liturgy and the Eucharist. Any child who has received first Holy Communion is eligible to be an altar server. Altar servers arrive 15 minutes prior to Mass, vest themselves with altar server robes, light the candles, and join for the prayer before Mass. Training is provided and altar servers may schedule when they are available.

**Altar Society:** All women of the parish are encouraged to join the Altar Society. These ladies manifest their love of God by the attention they give to the cleaning of the sanctuary and other parts of God's house. They purchase and care for the altar linens, altar cloths, altar server albs, cinctures, etc. The Altar Society also supports the Church Decorators Ministry in providing flowers and decorations, especially in preparation for Easter and Christmas.

Eucharistic Adoration: Also known as the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, it is the adoring or honoring of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This is an opportunity to spend as little as an hour (or as much time as you would like) once a week in the presence of God who made you and loves you. Bring your prayers, your joys, your works, and/or your sufferings to Him and experience His comfort and peace. It will be the best time you spend all week! There must be at least one person present at all times, so if you can commit to at least one hour per week, it would be most helpful. Adoration starts daily (Monday through Friday) after the 7 a.m. Mass and ends at 6 p.m. The daily Benediction is at 11:55 a.m. To signup to spend an hour with Our Lord, call the Parish Office at (541) 382-3631 or send an email to Judy Kennedy at judyekennedy@icloud.com.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: The Ordinary Ministers of Communion are the bishops, priests, and deacons. The Extraordinary Ministers of Communion are those who help in the distribution of the Precious Body and Blood of Christ during the Eucharist. #### **FAITH FORMATION**

### Adults:

• RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): This is the journey by those who wish to join the Catholic faith community. For those not yet baptized, this process leads to the Easter Vigil where the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist are received. Those who have been previously baptized in another Christian tradition are invited to participate fully in the Church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and the Eucharist.

RCIA classes are offered each year on Thursdays from 7 to 9 p.m., beginning in September until the Feast of Pentecost. If you or anyone you know would like to become a Catholic or learn about the Catholic faith, or if you want to be part of this ministry as a volunteer, call at (541) 382-3631, or email to rcia@stfrancisbend.org.

#### Children:

♦ The Religious Education Program for children offers catechetical classes to all children from Kindergarten through 5th Grade. Dedicated volunteer teachers instruct our children about the Faith, and prepare them for reception of the sacraments—especially First Holy Communion in the 2nd Grade. Fellowship: If Mass builds and strengthens our relationship with God (the vertical dimension), it is the fellowship after Mass that builds up and strengthens our relationship with one another. The coffee hour is after the 7:30 and 10 a.m. Masses, September to June, except on the first Sunday of the month, when the Knights of Columbus offer Sunday Breakfasts. This Ministry prepares, sets everything up for the coffee hour, and cleans up afterward. This ministry strengthens our Church as a family, as it helps promote relationships among members. Parishioners can help just by attending coffee hour. Visitors and newcomers are also introduced at the coffee hour.

Greeters and Ushers: This Ministry greets people as they enter church and provides them with liturgical aids for proper participation. Greeters make our church warm and welcoming. The Ushers direct and help people to find a seat at Mass, and they help the disabled in and out of church. They also take up the offertory collections. All parishioners, including families and couples, are invited to be part of this Ministry. Those in this Ministry need to be at the church a half hour before Mass. Training is provided. **Knights of Columbus**: This is an international society of more than 17 million Catholic men in more than 14,000 local councils dedicated to the ideals of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. The Bend Council, chartered in 1917, is instrumental in the work of the parish, supporting the activities of the handicapped, pro-life, financial aid to the seminarians, and supporting various youth programs.

Membership is limited to "practicing Catholic" men aged 18 or older. It was originally formed to render financial aid to members and their families. Mutual aid and assistance are offered to the sick, disabled, and needy family members.

In addition, social and intellectual fellowship is promoted among members and their families through educational, charitable, religious, social welfare, war relief, and public relief works. The Knights of Columbus often refers to its organization as the "strong right arm of the Church," and every Catholic man is encouraged to be part of this amazing organization. **Lectors:** Lectors are those who proclaim the word of God during the Eucharist and other liturgical services. In addition, lectors read the Prayers of the Faithful and announcements. Training is provided, and lectors may schedule based on their availability.

**Liturgy Committee:** This group meets periodically to coordinate special functions throughout the year—particularly during Advent, Lent, Christmas, and Easter, respectively.

# FAITH FORMATION—Children (Cont'd)

- ♦ RCIA for Children: This is for children 8 years and older who are not yet baptized. Children receive one year of faith formation and one year of sacramental preparation. During the second year, children experience special rites, and at the end of their sacramental preparation at the Easter Vigil, they receive the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation. - ♦ Sacramental Preparation: Beginning in the 2nd Grade, children are prepared for the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. This is a great Ministry where there is a curriculum to follow, and children are taught to learn and love the Catholic Faith. # FAITH FORMATION—Youth/Young Adults:

Youth/Young Adult Ministries: The goal of St. Francis Youth/Young Adult Ministries is to bring teens in Grades 6 through 12—and their families—closer to Jesus Christ through the sacraments and through liturgy, music, conferences, service to the Church and community, retreats, Faith Formation Classes and Youth Nights. - Confirmation (and Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist) Youth who are in 6th Grade or older and have journeyed on a year of faith formation the previous year, may start preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation. Faith and Life by Ignatius Press is used for classroom time on Wednesdays or Sundays, from 6:30 to 8 p.m., in addition to "sponsor nights," service, and a retreat.
- ♦ Faith Formation for Youth in Grades 6 to 8 who have not been involved in a formal Faith Formation program for over a year—or ever. Faith and Life by Ignatius Press is used. Classes meet Wednesdays, from 6:30 to 8 p.m. During the second year, the youth will enter the Confirmation classes to prepare to receive one or more sacraments: Baptism, Reconciliation, the Eucharist, and Confirmation.

# FAITH FORMATION—Youth/Young Adults (Cont'd):

♦ Youth Ministry for Middle and High School Youth uses *Edge and Life Teen*, a movement within the Roman Catholic Church, whose mission it is to lead teenagers and their families into a deeper relationship with Christ and His Church. The youth gather on Wednesday Youth Nights, attend Regional Youth Conferences, do community service, spend time at Eucharistic Adoration, and take part in Youth Masses.

#### FEEDING THE HUNGRY:

- ♦ Christmas Food Baskets: Each year, St. Francis provides food baskets for the needy families in our parish. **MUSIC MINISTRY:** The Music Ministry is an integral part of the liturgy of the Church. The role of the choir is to lead and enliven the congregation's singing, to serve as a small-group within the church for faith formation and community building; and to sing beautiful and challenging music to glorify God and uplift the congregation. The choirs provide a supportive and joyful environment where singers of all ages are inspired to offer music of beauty and prayerfulness that enhances worship and helps bring people closer to God.

All voices and experience levels are welcome in any of the choirs—Adult, Hispanic, Youth, and Children's.

- ♦ Adult Choir: New members are always welcome! Rehearsals are held every Wednesday, from 7 to 8:30 p.m., in the church. The Adult Choir offers a variety of music and sings at most Sunday 10 a.m. Masses, as well as at major feast days and liturgical events.
- Hispanic Choir: Provides music for the 12:30 p.m. Spanish Masses. Rehearsals are held every Tuesday, from 6:30 to 8 p.m., in the church. The Hispanic Choir combines with the Adult Choir for various bilingual liturgies, such as Holy Thursdays and Easter Vigils. The choir sings once a month for the Sunday 10 a.m. Mass; Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday; and once a month for the School Mass on Wednesday mornings at 8:15 a.m. Rehearsals are held on Wednesdays, from 3 to 4 p.m., in the Music Room.
- Cantor Program: Open to adults and youth who seek to serve and lead the parish in song.

Members are elected for a two-year term with the possibility of being reelected for another term. Once two terms are completed, the members must wait for at least a year before being elected again.
