



From the Pastor



Divine Mercy Sunday

Priate revelations and apparitions, which have been authenticated by the Church, have added greatly to the devotion of Catholics. However, even private revelations and apparitions authenticated by the Church do not add anything new to the fullness of revelation already given to us by Jesus, but they remind us that we have not been paying enough attention to Jesus, the fullness of revelation.

Therefore, authenticated private revelations and apparitions are both a summons and a wake-up call to be ever more sincere in turning away from sin and growing in faith in—and love of—Jesus.

In the year 2000, our Holy Father Pope John Paul II instituted a new feast—the Feast of Divine Mercy—to be celebrated for the first time in 2001 on the 2nd Sunday of Easter; i.e., today.

It arises out of a series of apparitions that a Polish nun, Sr. Faustina, received. Sr. Faustina was born in Poland in 1905, and when she was 20 years old, she entered the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, where she lived for the next 13 years—until her death on October 5, 1938. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1993 and canonized in 2000. When canonizing her, our Holy Father said:

Today my joy is truly great in presenting the life and witness of Sr. Faustina to the whole Church as a gift of God for our time. By Divine Providence, the life of this humble daughter of Poland was completely linked with the history of the twentieth century, the century we have just left behind. In fact, it was between the First and Second World Wars that Christ entrusted his message of mercy to her. Those who remember, who were witnesses and participants in the events of those years, and the horrible sufferings they caused for millions of people, know well how necessary was this message of mercy.

In April 1978, the Holy See in Rome permitted spread of this devotion. This does not mean that

you are required to believe in the apparitions or practice this devotion, but you are free to do so, and free to spread the devotion because the Church has found nothing in it contrary to our faith. The one primarily responsible for the Holy See approving the authenticity of the apparitions was Karol Wojtyla, then Archbishop of Cracow, and later that year elevated as Pope.

In 1981, Pope John Paul said his destined role was to bring the era of Divine Mercy into the world:

Right from the beginning of my ministry in St. Peter's See in Rome, I consider this message my special task. Providence has assigned it to me in the present situation of man, the Church and the world.

Today we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy, and so we usually call today *Divine Mercy Sunday*. Sr. Faustina was privileged to receive apparitions from Jesus emphasizing his mercy, and especially his mercy today. Jesus' promise is recorded three times in the *Diary of Saint Faustina*, each time in a slightly different way. This is the first teaching from Jesus:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. . . . The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day, all the divine flood-gates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy.


Sr. Lupe has been asked by her Religious Order to return to fill another emergency requirement. She will be leaving us on Saturday, April 17th.



Faith Formation

Confirmation 2021: Students preparing to receive Confirmation in 2021 should be (1) Giving at least 10 hours of service to the community—neighbors, church, (2) Researching a saint and writing a short paragraph, (3) Meeting with their sponsors either in person or virtual to complete the 4 workshops, (4) Getting familiar with the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit and twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit, and (5) writing a letter to Bishop Cary, explaining how you carried out and grew in faith from the last four points.

RCIA and Sacrament Preparation for Adults (age 18 and older): This is the class for Baptized Catholic adults who never received 1st Communion and/or Confirmation, and for unbaptized adults or baptized non-Catholic adults wishing to be received into the Catholic Faith. We do weekly homework and then come together every Thursday night on ZOOM.
