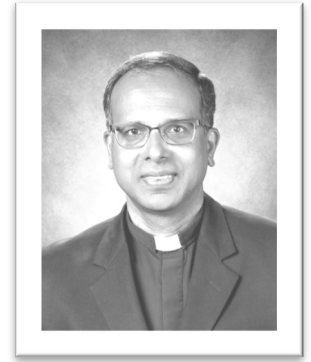

From the Pastor



Holy Week—The Grand Finale

The Easter Vigil

The celebration of Easter Vigil takes place at night. It is not celebrated at the time of the day that is customary to celebrate anticipated Sunday Masses. It is the greatest and noblest of all solemnities which has four parts. After the liturgy of the Light and Easter Proclamation (the first part) the Holy Church reflects on God's Word, recalling the wonders the Lord God has done for His people from the beginning (the second part). The new members are reborn in Baptism (the third part), and then the Church is invited to the Eucharistic table the Lord has prepared for His people, the memorial of His Death and Resurrection until He comes again (the fourth part).

The Easter Vigil includes the sacraments of initiation and the rite of reception of already baptized Christians into full communion with the Catholic Church. Nine readings are assigned to the Easter Vigil: seven from the Old Testament and two from the New Testament. However, due to its lengthy nature, we have chosen five readings: three from the Old Testament, one from the Epistle and the Gospel. The faithful who receive communion at the Vigil may also receive communion at another Mass on Easter Day.

On Easter Sunday, the rite of the renewal of Baptismal promises used at the Easter Vigil is used in the place of the Creed. The Easter Triduum ends with the Evening prayer on Easter Sunday. Beginning on Easter Sunday, the *Regina Coeli* is said in the place of the *Angelus*.

The Easter Season

The 50 days from the Sunday of the Lord's resurrection to Pentecost Sunday make up the Easter Season. These days are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day—indeed as one “great Sunday.” The first eight days of Easter season make up the octave of Easter and are celebrated as Solemnities of the Lord. At Holy Mass, Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer through the octave, a double *alleluia* is added to the dismissal and response.

The First Easter Preface is used through the octave of Easter through the Second Sunday of Easter. The Diocesan Eucharistic Pilgrimage arrives here on Easter Monday, April 21st, at 12:30 p.m. Then we will have 72 hours of adoration until we take the Eucharist in a car procession to the Church in Sisters.

We invite all to join us to welcome the Eucharist; sign up for adoration, join us for the Eucharistic procession through the neighborhood on Wednesday after the School Mass, and join the car procession to Sisters on

Thursday after the 12:15 p.m. Mass. Details are in the left column on page 5 of this bulletin.

Those newly baptized are especially remembered and prayed for during the season of Easter. The Paschal Candle, a symbol of the presence of the risen Christ among the people of God, remains in the sanctuary near the altar through Pentecost Sunday.

Infant baptisms are very appropriate during the Easter Season. And it is also fitting that children receive their First Communion on one of the Sundays or other days of the Easter Season. The First Communion at St. Francis is scheduled for Saturday, May 3rd, and Confirmation is on Sunday, May 4th.

The Sacred Paschal Triduum—the Last Supper, the death and resurrection of Jesus—are historical. Though these faith-anchoring events are historical, they cannot be repeated or “reenacted.” That is why the Church's long tradition insists that what happened once in history passes over into the mystery of the assembly's sacramental celebrations. What the Paschal Triduum actually celebrates is mystery and not history.

The liturgies of these days do not “take us back” to the upper room or the path to Calvary. Their ultimate purpose is not to retrace or relive the last hours of Jesus' life, nor to catch sight of Him emerging from the tomb at Easter's dawning. They celebrate not what once happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us as a people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit of holiness. They celebrate God taking possession of our hearts at their deepest core, recreating us as a new human community, broken like bread for the world's life.

I welcome you all who have joined us for the celebration of Easter. We are delighted to have you with us. A special word of welcome goes to all who are visiting us or returning after being away for a time. My deepest appreciation also goes to all who have helped us in the celebrations of Lent and Holy Week.

Easter Sunday is the triumphant finale of the Triduum, and the inseparable conclusion of the Holy Saturday Vigil. It is the preeminent Sunday, reminding us of why we celebrate Mass and worship the Lord throughout the year. *Alleluia* is the word for the day. We celebrate Jesus' victory over sin and death and His glorious return to life at Easter. So our Savior lives! He is alive! *Alleluia!*
