From the Pastor



Understanding the Old Testament

Regarding the passage from the book of Jeremiah 38:4–10, I would like to explain a bit about its historical context, and then reflect on how, when reading the Old Testament in the light of the Gospel, we get a glimpse of how God always wanted to free us from sin, but the people were unable to hear His voice through the prophets.

This text is set around the year 587 B.C., in the final days of the kingdom of Judah, just before the destruction of Jerusalem by the Babylonian Empire under King Nebuchadnezzar II. The king on the throne was Zedekiah (597–587 B.C.), the last king of Judah.

Babylon was still the dominant empire, having already subdued Judah years earlier and placed Zedekiah as a vassal king. Zedekiah rebelled against Babylon, seeking help from Egypt, which led Nebuchadnezzar to lay siege to Jerusalem. This stage lasted a long time, causing food shortages, and with them, a weakening of people's morale.

Jeremiah was a prophet who had been proclaiming for decades that Judah would be destroyed because of its unfaithfulness to God, and that the only way out was to surrender to Babylon. His messages were seen by the military leaders as defeatist or even treasonous, because they undermined the soldiers' and the people's will to resist. For this reason, the military commanders asked the king to have him executed.

Zedekiah, weak in character and pressured by his officials, allowed them to throw Jeremiah into a muddy cistern. The mud could easily immobilize him, and with the famine caused by the lack of food, it would have led to certain death.

Ebed-Melech was an Ethiopian official in the royal court, possibly a foreigner who had converted to Judaism. Moved by the injustice, he interceded with the king to rescue Jeremiah, and with 30 men, he pulled him out of the cistern, thus saving the prophet's life.

A few months later, in 587 B.C., Jerusalem fell to Babylon, resulting in the destruction of the Temple. Zedekiah was captured and taken to Babylon, while Jeremiah was freed by the Babylonians, as they saw him as someone who was not opposed to them.

From the account in Jeremiah 39:15–18, we know that Ebed-Melech received a promise of salvation from God because of his faith and courage.

Now let us look at this passage into the light of the Gospel: Jeremiah represents the messenger of God who does not remain silent, even when his message is unpopular. Although his prophecy went against military "patriotism," he spoke what God commanded—not what people wanted to hear. From this we learn that prophetic truth is not negotiated to please crowds or authorities.
