From the Pastor



A Savior Has Been Born for You

“Do not be afraid; for I proclaim to you the Good news of great joy that a Savior has been born for you” (Lk. 2:10-11). We have been celebrating our Savior’s birth for more than two thousand years—for good reasons. The birth of Christ changed world history as no other event ever did. This was not an ordinary birth. It was God becoming man. “The Word became flesh and dwelt among us” says John the Evangelist (Jn. 1:14). Can any other event in history be greater than this? Therefore, let us celebrate it inwardly and outwardly. Let us greet everyone a “Merry Christmas” Let our greeting be a statement of our faith. Let us be proud of whom we celebrate and believe in. Christmas is all about Christ. Let us place Him at the center of our life. He is the reason for the season.

The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The first Sunday after Christmas we celebrate the feast of The Holy Family which this year is 1st of January which is also the feast of Mary, Mother of God. The second Sunday after Christmas we will celebrate Epiphany and the day after that is the feast of Baptism of Our Lord.

The word “Christmas” is derived from the Middle English word *Cristemasse*, which comes from the Old English *Cristes Maesse*—a phrase that means “Christ’s Mass,” and it was first recorded in 1038. Over time, it became easier for people to just say “Christmas.” Way back in the 5th Century, Pope Leo I established the Feast of the Nativity to celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation. Christians had been celebrating Christmas for centuries before that. So, what Pope Leo I did was the formal articulation of something that was believed and celebrated for centuries.

The feast of Christmas offers convincing proof of God’s infinite love for us. For Jesus is God’s greatest gift to all mankind in a long line of precious blessings bestowed on each of us. Indeed, we have much to be thankful for as the St. Francis of Assisi Church family. The happy event of Christ-

mas is for our Parish Family a truly blessed event. A special word of appreciation to all of you who joined us to celebrate the birth of our Savior. Know that God loves each of you. May you carry away with you the fruits of this celebration.

A special word of thanks to all who helped us with the celebrations of Advent and Christmas, coordinated by **Dn. Phil McCarty**. My sincere thanks also to those who worked behind the scenes doing the decorating, led by **Lupita and Rick Wessler and Judy Kennedy**, getting the churches and the surroundings ready for the celebrations, the choirs, musicians, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, sacristans, greeters, ushers, those who prepared the liturgy, the new bulletin cover, and everyone else who helped in some way. Special thanks to the **Knights of Columbus** who prepared an amazing display of the Nativity at the entrance to the 27th Street Church.

I will be away on a family visit from December 25th to January 20th. It has been three years since I have been to India to see my family. I am looking forward to meeting my two-year-old nieces, the COVID-time miracle babies who were born to my brother and his wife after their 28 years of marriage. While in India, I will also officiate two weddings, attend an ordination ceremony at my local parish, participate in the priestly silver jubilee celebration of my cousin, and observe the 4th death anniversary ceremony of my Mom. I am not looking forward to another long flight tightly squeezed in economy. But I am looking forward to seeing my family and friends. Please keep me in your prayers. You will be in my daily thoughts and prayers.

Thanks a lot to all who have supported St. Francis Parish this year by prayers and sacrifices. All your generous support of our parish, loyalty, volunteer hours, and sacrifices are much appreciated. May God repay your graciousness and sacrifices this Christmas season and the New Year with an abundance of spiritual and material joys.


Safety Ministry
