# O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

e are beginning the season of Advent and the New Year B in the liturgical cycle. Advent is a special time. The word "Advent" is taken from the Latin word, *Adventus*, which means "arrival" or "coming"—not the coming of Santa Claus—but Christ the Savior. It is a time of **waiting**, which recalls the waiting of the people of Israel for the Messiah. Today, we wait for the second coming of Christ. We know neither the day nor the hour of that event.

The season of Advent is also a time of **preparation**. The Lord should find us prepared when He comes, ". . . like the servant ready to open the door when the master returns." A daily examination of conscience would greatly help us with this.

During this season we are also preparing to celebrate once again the first coming of Christ. Try to take time as individuals and as families to do something special every day for the Lord as your way of preparation.

The Advent Wreath is a central liturgical symbol of the Advent season. It integrates several elements that predate Christian faith. For ancient peoples, the wreath was a symbol of the life-giving rhythms of nature, and evergreen was a hopeful sign of life in the midst of winter. The candles on the wreath represent the sun's life-giving light. Lighting one additional candle each week signifies the movement of the sun, increasing the daylight. The Advent Wreath reflects the circular, eternal nature of God's love, even in harsh times, and the light of Christ that so permeates the night that "the darkness could not overcome." The purple candles signify longing, expectation, and hope while the pink candle represents joy.

The Jesse Tree celebrates the history of God's loving action in our world, leading up to the birth of Christ. The Jesse Tree helps us connect the custom of decorating Christmas trees to the events leading to Jesus' birth. The Jesse tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse,

and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David. We adorn a Jesse Tree with ornaments that represent the people, prophesies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The Jesse Tree bears symbols of the most significant manifestations of God's saving power down through history.

Dozens of the key events of Hebrew salvation history are represented, including Noah's Ark, the Burning Bush, the Ten Commandments, Jacob's Ladder, Joseph's Coat, and the Key of David. The ornaments on the Jesse Tree tell the story of God in the Old Testament, connecting the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across four thousand years of history.

Starting a Jesse Tree at home and decorating it each day with the suggested ornaments is a good way to prepare for Christmas.

The seven "O Antiphons" are part of Divine Office, the official daily prayer of the Church. They have been traditionally sung during evening prayer on the seven days before Christmas Eve. Each antiphon begins with the letter "O" followed by one of the biblical names for Christ: "O Wisdom," "O Lord," "O Root of Jesse," "O Key of David," "O Orient," "O King of the Gentiles," and "O Emmanuel." These beautiful prayers provide the lyrics for the most famous of all Advent hymns: "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

As it is a season of preparation, we will have Advent Confessions on **Tuesday**, **December 19th**, **from 6 to 7:30 p.m.**, with visiting priests available. Confessions are also heard at our normal times. All preparation for Christmas is incomplete without this all-important one: cleansing the mind and heart through a good confession. "Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight His paths for the Lord is near." Also, remember to invite your family and friends to Christmas Mass.


