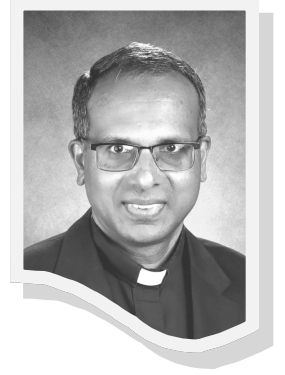

From the

Splendid India Tour—Part III

The next day, January 9th, was spent traveling to Kolkata, the “City of Joy.” After checking into our hotel, some of us went out to explore the neighborhood. There were people everywhere and traffic was as chaotic as in New Delhi. Then after a good night’s rest and breakfast, we left the hotel for a city tour.

The first stop was the Calcutta High Court building—the oldest in India. It was established as the High Court of Judicature at Fort William on July 1, 1862 under the High Courts Act of 1861.

Next, we stopped at St. Paul’s Cathedral Church. Established in 1847, it is said that this is the largest cathedral church you can visit in Kolkata. Most amazing is the beautiful architectural design that attracts many eyes and raises many an eyebrow of the visitors. St. Paul’s is an Anglican Cathedral that today operates under the Church of North India.

Then we went to the flower market where buyers and sellers converge from all over town, and we were pushed and shoved as we made our way through it. You can’t claim to have done Kolkata if you haven’t been to this iconic, century old Mullick Ghat Flower Market—one of the largest in Asia. People travel all over the city and suburbs to sell flowers there. It’s primarily for people who want to pickup flowers for temple offerings and prayers, and it’s a popular place for photographers who want to capture the feel of the city. The market also exports flowers to different parts of the country—and even to Europe. After shopping for flowers, people often sit at the tiny food carts around the place, sipping on chai from earthen cups with piping hot *kochuri* (a deep-fried puffy bread with a green-pea filling). This was an unforgettable experience.

After the flower market, we made our way to the Victoria Memorial—a large marble monument dedicated to Queen Victoria, the Empress of India from 1876 to 1901. It is the largest monument to a monarch anywhere in the world. Possessing prominent features of the Indo-Saracenic architecture, it has evolved into one of the most popular attractions in the city. In fact, the marble used to construct the building comes from the same Makrana quarries in Rajasthan that was used for the construction of the Taj Mahal, and the corner domes are faintly Mughal in style.

After visiting the Victoria Memorial, we went to the tomb of St. Theresa of Kolkata, where we celebrated the Holy Mass right next to it. It’s a very simple tomb, and across from it is the room where she lived and died. Like her simple lifestyle, her room has a wooden bed, a table with a chair, and a little cupboard. She was the founder of the Order of the Missionaries of Charity—a Roman Catholic congregation of women dedicated to the poor—particularly to the destitute of India.

In 1962, the Indian government awarded Mother Teresa the Padma Shri, one of its highest civilian honors, for her services to the people of India. She was also the recipient of numerous honors, including the 1979 Nobel Peace Prize for her humanitarian work, and the following year the Indian government conferred on her the Bharat Ratna, *the* country’s highest civilian honor.

In her later years, Mother Teresa spoke out against divorce, contraception, and abortion. She also suffered ill health and had a heart attack in 1989. In 1990, she resigned as head of the order but was returned to office by a nearly unanimous vote—the lone dissenting voice was her own! But her worsening heart condition forced her into retirement, and the order chose the Indian-born Sr. Nirmala as her successor in 1997.

At the time of Mother Teresa’s death, her order included hundreds of centers in more than 90 countries with some 4,000 nuns and hundreds of thousands of lay workers. Within two years of her death, the process to declare her a saint was begun, and Pope John Paul II issued a special dispensation to expedite the process of canonization. She was beatified on October 19, 2003, reaching the ranks of the blessed in what was then the shortest time in the history of the Church. She was canonized by Pope Francis I on September 4, 2016.

After our visit to the tomb of this amazing saint, we stopped at an open market to satisfy the “appetite for shopping,” thus ending our trip to Kolkata.

Now that we had completed our tour of north India, the following day was spent traveling to Kochi, in Kerala, my home state.




2024 Grief Ministry Educational Classes

Guidelines for Lent 2024

Lent prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. It is a time for reflection and spiritual renewal—a time to examine one's relationship with God and with others.

Lent is also the final preparation period for catechumens seeking to be baptized at the Easter Vigil.

As Catholics, the Church calls us to a spirit of repentance and conversion: "to turn away from sin, and to be faithful to the Gospel." Through our traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we express our conversion and prepare to renew our Baptismal promises at Easter.

Below are the Church's definitions of "fasting and abstinence," as well as the obligatory minimum requirements that she asks of us.

- ▶ **Abstinence:** Meat and poultry are removed from our meals; fish is acceptable.
- ▶ **Fasting:** Eat one (1) full meal and two (2) smaller meals; no snacking during the day.
- ▶ **All Catholics** between the ages of 18 and 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- ▶ **All Catholics** 14 years and older are to abstain from meat and poultry on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

The Parish Office will be closed on **Monday, February 19th**, in observance of President's Day. There will be no Adoration on that day as it is a Federal Holiday.

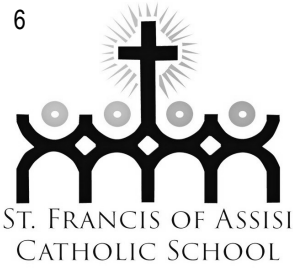
