



From the Pastor



St. Joseph, the Most Chaste

“All the baptized are called to chastity. The Christian has ‘put on Christ,’ the model for all chastity. All Christ’s faithful are called to lead a chaste life in keeping with their particular states of life. At the moment of his Baptism, the Christian is pledged to lead his affective life in chastity” (CCC 2348).

Our culture does not hold the virtue of chastity in high esteem. Therefore, it can seem incredible to us that a man like Joseph was able to rise to the lofty challenge presented to him: to be the “chaste guardian of the Virgin” (and of all virgins) and the foster-father of the Son of God. Such a task requires both remarkable human virtue and God’s grace. St. Joseph had both.

Have you heard of the White Cord of St. Joseph? The White Cord of St. Joseph is piously used—asking the intercession of St. Joseph against physical ailment, and to live the virtues of chastity and purity of heart. This beautiful devotion began almost 400 years ago in the small town of Antwerp, Belgium. An Augustinian nun named Sr. Elizabeth, who was suffering from a mysterious and painful illness—and had a special devotion to St. Joseph—asked that a cord be blessed in his honor. She wrapped this cord around her waist. A few days later, her pain disappeared while she was praying for St. Joseph’s intercession. Multiple doctors who studied her case proclaimed her cure to be miraculous.

On September 19, 1859, the devotion of St. Joseph’s cord was officially adopted, a blessing formula created, indulgences added by Pope Pius IX, and widespread private use permitted. The White Cord of St. Joseph is piously used as a support in living the virtues of chastity and purity of heart.

The Cord of St. Joseph is cotton thread or cotton ending at one extremity in seven knots, indicative of the Seven Joys and Sorrows of St. Joseph. It is worn as a girdle for purity or chastity and

humility, and around the shoulders for obedience. There are five primary graces attached to the wearing of the cord and the pious recitation of the corresponding prayers: St. Joseph’s special protection, purity of soul, the grace of chastity, final perseverance, and particular assistance at the hour of death.

Joseph’s love and devotion to Christ and Our Lady are an example to all believers, but his role in salvation history is particularly masculine, and it is revealed through his chastity. Chastity is a virtue that places its own desires aside and works for the good of another. It trains the body to give up its selfish desires and sacrifice itself. It’s a virtue that fixes a toilet, even though we would rather watch a movie. It gets you out of bed at 3 a.m. to change a diaper, even though it’s your spouse’s turn to do it.

Chastity turns our bodies into an instrument of sacrificial love. Chastity pays careful attention to avoid all occasions of sin, especially the sins of the flesh. It carefully selects what one decides to watch, read, listen to, and speak. The virtue of chastity cannot be cultivated without carefully watching over our senses. It is the most beautiful of all virtues that makes our soul spotless and pure.

It was Joseph’s virtue of chastity that safeguarded the perpetual virginity of the Mother of God, and allowed him to guide and protect Mary and Jesus with such strength of pure love. This should be a great consolation to us who strive to practice purity of mind, heart and body. The heart of St. Joseph should give us great hope that the virtue of chastity lies within our reach, thanks to the grace of God and the intercession of Joseph-most-chaste!

As a disciple of Christ, we are called to chastity, and Mary, the New Eve, is our divine aid. Drawing close to her and to Christ, as St. Joseph did, will make us more open, more patient, more loving, and more chaste.





Guidelines for Lent 2021

As Catholics, the Church calls us to a spirit of repentance, to turn away from sin, and to be faithful to the Gospel. Through the traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we express conversion in relation to ourselves, to God and to others.

Below are the Church's definitions of "fasting and abstinence," as well as the obligatory minimum requirements that she requires of us.

Abstinence: Meat and poultry are removed from our meals—fish is acceptable.

Fasting: Eat one (1) full meal and two (2) smaller meals—no snacking during the day.

- ◆ All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- ◆ All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from meat and poultry on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
