From the Pastor



Lent is here . . .

We have just begun the season of Lent with the imposition of ashes observed on Ash Wednesday. It's been three years since the outbreak of the Corona virus pandemic. Parishes had to close the church doors at the beginning of the outbreak and move to online live streaming. We continue to livestream weekend Masses today for the sake of those who are sick or homebound and cannot get to church. We are very grateful that we can gather together to celebrate the Holy Eucharist and other sacraments. There are a few who still give the excuse of the Corona virus to stay away from Mass. We keep up our prayers for ALL to return to church. We live *not* by fear—but by *faith*.

Lent is a journey accompanying Jesus into the desert fasting, praying and almsgiving. Remember to find some extra time for prayer and penance during Lent to focus on what this season is all about. Try going to a weekday Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, the Stations of the Cross, reading the Scripture daily, and spending some time in personal prayer. And do not neglect fasting. It could be fasting from food and drinks, fasting from excessive use of material things, or fasting from some stubborn habits that you may have grown into during the year. Lenten reflection materials such as *The Word Among Us* is also available in the narthex of both churches. Have a special jar on your dining table during Lent to put in your savings from the sacrifices you make every day, and then when Easter comes, give those savings to benefit the needy.

We will also have our Lenten Mission from March 6th to March 9th, starting at 6:30 p.m., in English, preached by Fr. Serge Probst. He will give a shorter version of the talk daily after the 7 a.m. Mass on each of those Mission days. You do not want to miss out on these days of special blessings!

The theme of Lenten observance for us this year is in line with the Eucharistic Revival that we are currently in: **“Come to Me. I Am the Bread of Life.”** It reflects the reality of the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist and His desire that we approach Him with faith and trust. It is an invitation and a declaration of faith. We will be ending the

last weekend Masses of each month with Benediction to grow in our love and devotion to the Eucharist. You should have received my Lenten letter last week with all the details that St. Francis Parish offers during this Lenten and Holy Week.

The most important thing anyone can do for Lent is to “return to the Lord with your whole heart” (Joel 2:12). That is the root meaning of repent: to turn around. Catholics have traditionally expressed sorrow for sin and the desire to live as genuine Disciples of Christ through the three traditional Lenten disciplines of fasting, almsgiving and prayer. These Lenten disciplines will prepare you to receive the grace of Easter. These disciplines are aimed at purifying and transforming our lives, to help us rise with Christ to the challenges of self-giving love.

Fasting is the most powerful spiritual discipline of all the Christian disciplines. Through fasting and prayer, the Holy Spirit can transform your lives. It helps us spiritually and physically. Fasting is one of the most neglected spiritual practices today. Yet, it is the most effective means of getting rid of our stubborn, evil inclinations, obsessions, and bad habits. It's a great tool to self-discipline. Jesus Himself fasted and taught His disciples about fasting.

Fasting is a time when we abstain from food or other pleasures and take the time to focus on God. Denying something physical to glorify God and enter into a deeper relationship with Him is the spirit of fasting. It is a way to demonstrate that we are serious about our relationship with God and that He comes first. The Church requires us to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Anyone over the age of 18, but under the age of 60, should eat only one full meal on those days. The Church also invites us to practice abstinence. It means anyone 14 years or older must abstain from meat on all Fridays. The USCCB allows substitution of some other forms of penance for abstinence on all of the Fridays of the year, except the Fridays in Lent. I pray for a grace-filled Lenten journey.

Guidelines for Lent 2023

- † Lent prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. It is a time for reflection and spiritual renewal. As Catholics, the Church calls us to a spirit of repentance and conversion "to turn away from sin, and to be faithful to the Gospel."
- † Below are the Church's definitions of "fasting and abstinence," as well as the obligatory minimum requirements that she asks of us.
- † Abstinence: Meat and poultry are removed from our meals—fish is acceptable.
- † Fasting: Eat one (1) full meal and two (2) smaller meals—no snacking during the day.
- † All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to fast on Good Friday.
- † All Catholics 14 years & older are to abstain from meat and poultry on all Fridays of Lent & Good Friday.

The Word Among Us daily meditation booklets bring the Lenten and Easter seasons to life with helpful teachings, prayers, and reflections. Booklets are available in the narthex at both churches.

About Fr. Serge: Fr. Serge Probst was born in 1942 to devout Southern Baptist parents in Aiken, South Carolina. He grew up in several different states, including New Jersey and Tennessee. He graduated from Aiken High and obtained a degree in Biology at the University of South Carolina. As a university student, he converted to the Catholic Faith. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy after graduation, and four years later—after being discharged from the Navy—he entered the Dominican Novitiate for the Western Dominican Province.

After completing his studies, he was ordained in 1973. He then earned a Doctorate in Theology and taught at the University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, popularly known as the Angelicum, for 15 years, and then at the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology for another 10 years. During all this time, Fr. Serge also served as an itinerant preacher giving parish missions, novenas, retreats, etc. At the same time, he also worked with the Missionaries of Charity all over the world—and knew St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta.

2023 Stewardship Campaign *Belong, Believe, Be Disciples*

Summary Report—February 14, 2023

To date we have had responses from 395 parishioners with a grand total of \$884,950 committed for Offertory, Historic Church Restoration, and Scholarship for 2023. This a response rate of 20.7% for the campaign so far.

2023 Details

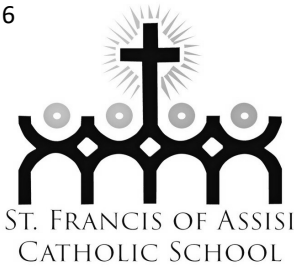
331 parishioners have committed \$705,588 to the Offertory.

The first mailing generated 325 responses, committing a total of \$767,088 for 2023.

The second mailing has generated 70 responses to date, committing an additional \$117,862 for 2023.
