

From the Pastor



Making Disciples: Part 2

How do we make disciples? A disciple is one who learns—who yearns to grow and hungers for knowledge. Something must happen to awaken that hunger: that is evangelization! “To evangelize” literally means to announce the good news who is Jesus.

In Jesus, we have the very embodiment of God’s salvation presence, love, mercy and life. To know the good news is to know Christ, love Him and to be in love with Him. Only when we come to encounter him personally as alive and real do we then desire to walk His ways, hunger for His truth and seek to live His life. Those who do not know Him will have no hunger for Him. The truth is that there are so many people who believe in Christ and go to church who have not come to know Him personally and, therefore, have no hunger for Him. Many Catholics are content with their weekly or whenever possible Church attendance. They are missing out on the full power of Christian faith.

What needs to be done? There must be New Evangelization. Jesus must be proposed anew. We must labor to create spaces for people to come to know Jesus as the living Lord, and awaken that hunger, and then begin to form them to make disciples. We must rediscover our identity and mission as a missionary Church here at St. Francis, and do our share. Christ’s mandate to make disciples should be at the heart of all we do here at St. Francis. We need to become disciples who are committed to a lifelong learning, who discover their God-given talents, who are prepared to serve and eventually become apostles.

Being a church of disciples is just a part of our calling. This Church of disciples must “go”

and “make disciples” of all nations, of all people. Christ’s mandate is to proclaim the good news, not just to lukewarm or fallen-away Catholics, but to all who do not know Him and His Church. We are called to go. Jesus said, “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”

The word “apostle” comes from the Greek word *apostellein*, which means “to be sent.” An apostle is one who is sent, and one of the four essential characteristics of the Church is being apostolic. Thus, we are a Church that is sent, and an apostle is a missionary. When we say that the Church is apostolic, it means that it is missionary by nature, apart from the fact that it has the apostles as its foundation. Therefore, our deepest identity is to be an apostle—a missionary. Hence, from becoming a disciple, we must eventually become apostles who are sent.

The Church is at its best when it evangelizes, makes more disciples who can be baptized and taught, and eventually sent out. That is a healthy Church that makes the most impact on the lives of people. The Church is not healthy when she is turned into herself and has forgotten her calling to be a light to the nations.

A Church that has forgotten its mission will have very little impact on the lives of people, and it will eventually be forgotten. Therefore, as the St. Francis of Assisi Parish, we need to rediscover our mission to evangelize, commit to become intentional disciples, and eventually become apostles who make disciples.

I am happy that we are starting out on a solid path to becoming and making disciples.²

Fr. Roemer will also preside at the **12:15 p.m. Masses on March 7th through 10th**, and he will give a shortened version of his Mission Message for that night.


About Fr. Roemer

Fr. Richard Roemer has been a member of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal since 1990. Ordained in 1998, he has served his congregation and the Church in a variety of services for the poor, works of evangelization and formation.

He guided the opening of a friary in London in 2000 and then served in the formation of young friars in New York and New Jersey for 7 years.

He helped to initiate ministries such as the St. Francis Center for Youth in the Bronx, the St. Joseph’s Soup Kitchen in Harlem, and the St. Anthony Shelter for Renewal for homeless men in the Bronx.

He served 3 terms as Vicar General of the CFRs, and he is currently serving in Comayagua, Honduras, directing the formation of postulants from Central and South America. He also enjoys preaching retreats and missions and accompanying people in spiritual direction.
