

# Splendid India Tour—Part II



N SUNDAY, JANUARY 7th, we began the day with the Holy Mass, celebrating the Feast of the Epiphany. Then after breakfast, we went to visit the Qutub Minar, a minaret built in the early 13th Century just south of New Delhi.

The surrounding archaeological area contains funerary buildings—notably the magnificent Alai-Darwaza Gate—a masterpiece of Indo-Muslim art that was built in 1311, and two mosques, including the Quwwat-ul-Islam, the oldest in northern India, built of materials reused from some 20 Brahman temples. It is known as the "victory tower" and forms part of the Qutub complex. It is also a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The next place we visited in New Delhi was the Lotus Temple, a Bahá'í House of Worship dedicated in December 1986. Notable for its lotus-like shape, it has become a prominent attraction in the city.

Like all Bahá'í Houses of Worship, the Lotus Temple is open to all, regardless of religion. The building is composed of 27 free-standing, marble-clad "petals" arranged in clusters of three to form nine sides, with nine doors opening onto a central hall. It has the capacity to hold 1,300 people. The Lotus Temple has won numerous architectural awards.

After visiting the Lotus Temple, we drove by the India Gate which is a war memorial in the same concept as the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Built in memory of the soldiers who died in all wars beginning with WW I, it has bricks with the names etched in gold of more than 95,000 Indian soldiers.

From there we drove by the Parliament House and the House of the President of India.

On our way back, we visited the Lakshmi Narayan Hindu Temple. Many of us were entering a Hindu temple for the first time. I was surprised to learn that anyone can enter this temple, because usually those belonging to lower castes among Hindus and those of other religions are not allowed into the temples. However, I learned that it was built by the Birla family at the specific request of Mahatma Gandhi to have a temple where everyone is welcome to worship. There are several little shrines in the temple dedicated to different Hindu gods and goddesses.

After our visit to the temple, we returned to our hotel and had our dinner at 7:30 p.m. Dinners are part

of the package, and the spread was amazing—with food available for those who love spice and for those who do not prefer spicy foods. There was also a variety of desserts.

WE BEGAN THE third day of the tour, January 8th, with a visit to the Taj Mahal. We left the hotel at 6:30 a.m. to catch a train to Agra. It left the station on time, but due to dense fog, we arrived at Agra an hour and a half later than the scheduled time. We were taken in a golf cart to the entrance of the majestic Taj Mahal—one of the seven wonders of the world and which took 20,000 people and 22 years to build.

The Taj Mahal ("Crown of the Palace") is an ivory white marble mausoleum built on the right bank of the Yamuna River. It was commissioned in 1631 by the fifth Mughal emperor, Shah Jahan, to house the tomb of his beloved wife, Mumtaz Mahal. It also houses the tomb of Shah Jahan himself. The tomb is the centerpiece of a complex that includes a mosque and a guest house and is set in formal gardens that are bounded on three sides by a crenellated wall.

The Taj Mahal was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1983 for being "the jewel of Muslim art in India and one of the universally admired master-pieces of the world's heritage." It is regarded by many as the best example of Mughal architecture and a symbol of India's rich history. It attracts 7 to 8 million visitors a year.

After the Taj, we visited the historical Agra Fort—known as the Red Fort—because it was built with red stones and marble. Mughal Emperor Humayun was crowned there. It was later renovated by the Mughal Emperor Akbar in 1565, and the present-day structure was completed in 1573. It served as the main residence of the rulers of the Mughal dynasty until 1638, when the capital was shifted from Agra to Delhi.

In 1983, the Red Fort was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site because of its importance during the Mughal Dynasty. It was later renovated by Shah Jahan, which is the marbled section of the Fort.

After the Red Fort, we went to the railway station to catch the train back to New Delhi and the hotel.

### **Guidelines for Lent 2024**

Lent prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. It is a time for reflection and spiritual renewal—a time to examine one's relationship with God and with others.

Lent is also the final preparation period for catechumens seeking to be baptized at the Easter Vigil.

As Catholics, the Church calls us to a spirit of repentance and conversion: "to turn away from sin, and to be faithful to the Gospel." Through our traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we express our conversion and prepare to renew our Baptismal promises at Easter.

Below are the Church's definitions of "fasting and abstinence," as well as the obligatory minimum requirements that she asks of us.

- ► **Abstinence:** Meat and poultry are removed from our meals; fish is acceptable.
- ► Fasting: Eat one (1) full meal and two (2) smaller meals; no snacking during the day.
- ► All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- ► All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from meat and poultry on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.


