



From the Pastor



St. Joseph, the Most Just—Part 1

There is not much mentioned in the Bible about Joseph. In fact, not a single word of Joseph has ever been recorded; we only have record of him as to what he did, and not by what he said. We know about him by what he “did”: “by their fruits you shall know them” (Matthew 7:16). This proves that Joseph was not a man who was known by his knowledge of the Scriptures, but of his quietness, and therefore, his righteousness.

All we know about Joseph from the Bible is that he was a carpenter by trade, and in Matthew 1:19, it states that Joseph was “a just man.” It has been mentioned that “the hiddenness of Joseph encourages us to seek holiness in life through the ordinary events of daily life.” St. Joseph wasn’t a man who did miracles, or raised people from the dead; he was a humble servant of God who was considered worthy enough to be Jesus Christ’s father in the flesh.

Whenever we take a closer look at the person of Joseph, the husband of Mary, we soon realize that we tend to take St. Joseph for granted not because we like to ignore him, but because we naturally assume Jesus alone deserves all our attention. The Bible refers to Joseph as a just man. (Matthew 1:19). This means he was a man of integrity. He was well respected in the community. He had a good name. He was a man of justice. He was not a wayward person, and he believed in doing what was right at all times.

According to the Coptic tradition, when Mary had completed 12 years in the sanctuary, the priests took counsel in order to find someone whom they could give her to, in marriage, to protect her because she was consecrated to God. When Mary had reached this age, she was no longer allowed to stay in the temple. The priests wanted to find a man who would protect her and keep her safe. They gathered 12 righteous men from the house of David of the tribe of Judah (St. Joseph’s lineage is in Matthew 1:17 and Luke 3:23). The priests gathered these men’s staffs to put them in the sanctuary. The next morning, the priests went into the sanctuary and found that St. Joseph’s staff had blossomed into a flowering rod (“the flower of the rod of Jesse”). This, by the way, is usually how St. Joseph is pictured—with his flowering rod. The priests knew that this was a sign from God and that St. Mary was to be with St. Joseph. The Holy Gospel bore witness that he was a righteous man, and God chose him to be betrothed to the all-pure, our lady, the Virgin Mary.

We cannot truly understand the justice or righteousness of St. Joseph if we look at justice the way the world understands it. The world’s understanding of justice is based on the principle of “an eye for eye and a tooth for a tooth.” It is the justice of the law—it is following and fulfilling the demands of the law. But God’s sense of justice is one that “causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous” (Matthew 5:45). It is a justice with mercy or compassion. It is a justice that does not call for retribution. “If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well . . . love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you” (Matthew 5:39-40, 44). This is God’s sense of righteousness and justice as understood in the Scriptures—a justice with a deep sense of compassion and mercy. It is this sense of justice that we see in St. Joseph, and I wish to reflect further on this next week.



**USCCB Statement on the
New COVID-19 Vaccines**

The USCCB has addressed the moral concerns raised by the fact that the vaccines in the United States all have some connection to cell lines that originated with tissue taken from abortions.



With regard to the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, they concluded: “In view of the gravity of the current pandemic and the lack of availability of alternative vaccines, the reasons to accept the new COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna are sufficiently serious to justify their use, despite their remote connection to morally compromised cell lines.

“Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.”

The Story of Us –Virtual Auction February 6, 2021

Did you know that many years ago St. Francis of Assisi School had a football team?

Our students were the “Saints.” Years later the school population was smaller because we no longer had a middle school. It was no longer necessary to use our mascot name, and the St. Francis Saints were nearly forgotten.

In 1990, a grassroots effort restored our middle school. No one in the building at that time considered a team name. Our soccer and basketball jerseys were simply labelled St. Francis.

In 2002, we adopted the team name “Wolfpack” after the story of St. Francis and the wolf. In 2017, another grassroots effort restored our mascot name to “Saints.”



St. Francis currently has 152 students enrolled. We have 11 grade levels from Preschool – 8th Grade. We also offer Extended Care. Art, Library, Music, P.E., Spanish, and STEM classes are offered each week.


