



## From the Pastor



### St. Joseph, the Most Just—Part 2

**T**he gospel of Matthew is careful to portray Joseph as “faithful to the law.” The English Standard Version (ESV) of the Bible translates this phrase as simply “a just man,” while the New American Standard Bible (NASB) and the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) both use “righteous man.” It appears the New International Version’s (NIV) translation gets to the heart of the matter best. Joseph, being a righteous Jew, was careful to keep the Law of Moses, which allowed separation for infidelity (Deuteronomy 24:1).

By the 1st Century, Jewish tradition called for divorce to take place in a very public way. As per custom, Mary would have stood in the public square to face questions about her faithfulness to Joseph. All the townspeople would be watching—and likely judging. Joseph wanted no part in this. He decided instead to “divorce her quietly” and spare Mary the public spectacle.

The text never says explicitly that Joseph was angry with Mary. He may very well have been. But Matthew’s point is to show the compassion of Joseph. As a righteous man, he would have been compelled to pursue this public action. And yet, Matthew 1:19 tells us that Joseph did not want to expose Mary to this public trial. Compassion wins out over the letter of the law.

Matthew is not contrasting the righteousness of following the Law against the righteousness of grace. It is true that the letter kills, but the Spirit brings life (2 Corinthians 3:6). Yet the same Holy Spirit who inspired both the Old Testament and the New Testament is full of compassion, and Matthew is presenting us with a picture of human compassion in action through the story of Jesus’ earthly father.

St. Joseph, received three dreams of which we are aware. In the first, and most important, he was told not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife. A second dream took place after Jesus’ birth in Bethlehem. Joseph was told to take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt because the wicked King Herod meant to kill Jesus. After Herod died, and while the Holy Family was in Egypt, Joseph had the third dream—this one telling him to return to Palestine, which he did, but to avoid Jerusalem.

The most important information we have about Joseph is not that he was a dreamer; it was that Joseph was a righteous man—a just man. A just person puts his or her relationship with God before all else in life and cares for people as God would care for them. In Scriptures, someone who is just reflects God’s compassion.

Joseph was a just man and so a compassionate man. He would not do this to the girl. He would not expose Mary to the law. He was certain that God couldn’t possibly want that to happen. He would send her away to a distant relative where she could live somewhat of a normal life with the child. Treating Mary with kindness was more important than his rights before the Law.

Joseph was not only to care for Mary and the child, he was to name the child. This child would really—not physically—but really be Joseph’s. The Church recognizes that by becoming the father of the Holy Family, Joseph became the father of the Universal Church.

Joseph is one of our greatest saints. His greatness flows from the fact that he was righteous. He was just. He was compassionate. Today we pray to St. Joseph to give us the courage to be righteous and just with a deep sense of compassion.



January’s virtue is Justice.

Catholic school in Bend, Oregon, started on September 19, 1936. The Sisters of the Holy Names started the school with four full classrooms but no uniforms. However, the Sisters were enthusiastic and persuasive in support for a uniform policy—which they were able to implement the following year. On October 1, 1937, the sisters’ community diary noted that there was “excitement in the air” as students arrived for the first time in the new uniforms, which consisted of navy blue jumpers and white-collared shirts for girls, and dress suits for boys.

Years later, the uniform was dropped from the requirements for students. It wasn’t until the return of the Holy Names Order with Principal, Sr. Kathleen Cordes, and Sr. Ruth Dawley that the idea of uniforms was again accepted. The children’s input, in 1997, was that the uniform had to be comfortable and have choices for girls and boys. The parents’ input was that they had to be affordable, available, and easy to maintain. Our current uniform rules—red, white, and blue polo shirts with navy blue or khaki pants, shorts, “skorts,” skirts, or jumpers, sweaters, sweatshirts and belts—turned out to be the perfect solution. Plaid jumpers and school team sweatshirts were added to our uniform in 2002, and belts were made optional for students.

This means that the current uniform policy has been in place now for 23 years—and it’s working well for our St. Francis community.


