

From the Pastor



Preserving the Sacred: The Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Baker

On the weekend of January 22/23, the Diocese will be conducting the fourth annual Cathedral Conservation Collection. St. Francis de Sales Cathedral, located in Baker City, is the “Church of the Diocese.” Construction took three years from 1905–08. It is only in a Cathedral where one can find the “cathedra,” the chair of the bishop.

The Diocese of Baker City was officially established on June 19, 1903. A week later, Bishop Charles O’Reilly, Pastor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Portland, was appointed as the first Bishop of Baker. At 66,800 square miles, the new Diocese was one of the largest in area, but one of the smallest in numbers—and still is.

On Sunday, May 14, 1905, Mass was celebrated for the last time in the old Mission Church of St. Francis de Sales in Baker City. The original church built in 1871 is still in existence as a private residence on First Street—one block from the Cathedral.

The time had come to replace the church in Baker City with an appropriate Cathedral. The old church was removed from the site on May 20, 1905, and ground was broken for the new building on May 24, 1905. The present-day Cathedral was built of stone native to the area. The foundation stone laid down in 1906 is still to be seen between the two main doors. The completed Cathedral was dedicated on April 9, 1908.

St. Francis de Sales Cathedral belongs to every Catholic in the Diocese. For years, the small Cathedral parish has borne the burden of maintaining this large and historic building. Three years ago, the Presbyteral Council of the Diocese, in consultation with Bishop Cary, decided to bring relief to the Cathedral parish by conducting an annual Cathedral Conservation Collection.

Since its inception, this collection has assisted the cathedral in two major projects. Thank you for your generosity in 2021 to the Cathedral Conservation Collection, which brought in \$94,785 from all the parishes in the diocese, along with \$75,000 from a generous donor from St. Francis, totaling \$169,785. This collection allowed the parish to replace the entire boiler and heating controls. The broken and missing granite blocks have also been replaced and repainted. Most recently, through your generosity, all of the wood on the exterior has been repaired and repainted. This grand old Cathedral is beginning to shine again, thanks to you.

The next major project for the cathedral will be the replacement of the front stairs of the cathedral. If you look at any photo of the cathedral, you will immediately see that this is going to be a major project. Your help is still needed.

The Cathedral Conservation Collection is this weekend, January 22/23. Yellow donation envelopes for the Cathedral collection are in the pews. I ask that you prayerfully consider making a donation to this necessary collection.

Please make your checks payable to our parish, and drop it off in the basket when the second collection is taken up after Communion. You may also drop them by the parish office, or mail them to us. We will then write one check to the Diocese for the amount collected.

You have proven your generosity time after time and I thank you. Let us continue our commitment to our beloved cathedral, and keep it in the best condition we can for future generations of Catholics. God Bless you, and I thank you for your generosity.


