



From the Pastor



Moral Permissibility of COVID-19 Vaccines

Now that more and more vaccines are being prepared to inoculate the humanity from COVID-19 that has shaken the world out of its routines and left human life in disarray, there have been questions on the moral permissibility of these vaccines. The Catholic Church has always taught and continues to teach the sanctity of life from conception to natural death. It is because of this respect for the human person that the Catholic Church in collaboration with other organizations, working to protect human life, has been engaged in a campaign advocating for the development of a vaccine for COVID-19 that has no link to abortion.

In April 2020, four USCCB bishops, along with representatives of 20 other organizations, wrote to the Commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, asking it to help ensure “that Americans will have access to vaccines that are free from any connection to abortion.”

While some pharmaceutical companies have been working on a vaccine for COVID-19 without using morally compromised cell lines at all, others have been using such cell lines in either the design and development phase or the production phase or in both. Still others have been making use of a morally compromised cell line only for a confirmatory test of the vaccine’s efficacy. This leads many people who are concerned for the sanctity of human life to ask if it is ethical to accept any of the vaccines that have some connection to abortion.

There are currently three vaccines that have been presented as having demonstrated their effectiveness and that are made available: those from Pfizer, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. The situation of the first two is essentially the same. Neither Pfizer nor Moderna used morally compromised cell lines in the design, development, or production of the vaccine. A confirmatory test, however, employing the commonly used, but morally compromised HEK293 cell line, was performed on both vaccines. Thus, while neither vaccine is completely free from any connection to morally compromised cell lines, in this case the connection is very remote from the initial evil of the abortion.

“In view of the gravity of the current pandemic and the lack of availability of alternative vaccines, the reasons to accept the new COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna are sufficiently serious to justify their use, despite their remote connection to morally compromised cell lines. In addition, receiving the COVID-19 vaccine ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.

The AstraZeneca vaccine is more morally compromised. The HEK293 cell line was used in the design, development, and production stages of that vaccine, as well as for confirmatory testing.

The current vaccine for rubella (German measles), although developed earlier, relies on morally compromised cell lines in much the same way as the newly developed AstraZeneca vaccine. The AstraZeneca vaccine should be avoided if there are other alternatives available.

It may turn out, however, that one does not really have a choice of a vaccine—at least, not without a lengthy delay in immunization that may have serious consequences for one’s health and the health of others. In such a case, just as accepting a vaccination for rubella with a morally compromised vaccine is morally permissible because of the lack of alternatives, and the serious risk to the public health, so it would be permissible to accept the AstraZeneca vaccine.”*

My intent in writing this is to share with you what the Church teaches on the moral permissibility of vaccines and not to pressure anyone into taking or not taking it. Every individual will need to make that decision after a careful analysis of its benefits, risks and one’s own health condition.

THE MASK SHOULD COVER YOUR NOSE AND MOUTH—NOT SIMPLY THE MOUTH AS SOME ARE DOING.



Candlemas Day


There will be a special Mass in Spanish on **February 2nd, at 7 p.m.**, at the 27th Street Church to celebrate Candlemas Day.

Candlemas, also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the Feast of the Holy Encounter, commemorates the presentation of Jesus at the temple.

It is based upon the account of the presentation of Jesus in Luke 2:22–40. Candlemas always falls on February 2nd, which traditionally is the 40th day of—and the conclusion of—the Christmas–Epiphany season.


