



From the Pastor



Year of St. Joseph: Part 2

Pope Francis has promoted devotion to St. Joseph throughout his pontificate. He began his Petrine Ministry on March 19, 2013, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, and dedicated the homily at his inauguration Mass to the saint. His coat of arms features a spikenard, which is associated with St. Joseph in Hispanic iconographic tradition. On May 1, 2013, the pope authorized a decree instructing that St. Joseph's name be inserted into Eucharistic Prayers II, III, and IV.

During an apostolic visit to the Philippines in 2015, the pope explained why he kept an image of the saint on his desk. "I would also like to tell you something very personal," he said. "I have great love for St. Joseph, because he is a man of silence and strength. On my table I have an image of St. Joseph sleeping. Even when he is asleep, he is taking care of the Church! Yes! We know that he can do that. So when I have a problem, a difficulty, I write a little note, and I put it underneath St. Joseph, so that he can dream about it! In other words, I tell him: pray for this problem!"

In the Apostolic Letter, *Patris Corde*, Pope Francis says, "Every true vocation is born of the gift of oneself, which is the fruit of mature sacrifice. The priesthood and consecrated life likewise require this kind of maturity. Whatever our vocation, whether to marriage, celibacy or virginity, our gift of self will not come to fulfillment if it stops at sacrifice; were that the case, instead of becoming a sign of the beauty and joy of love, the gift of self would risk being an expression of unhappiness, sadness and frustration."

He continued: "When fathers refuse to live the lives of their children for them, new and unexpected vistas open up. Every child is the bearer of a unique mystery that can only be brought to light with the help of a father who respects that child's freedom. A father who realizes that he is most a father and educator at the point when he becomes 'useless,' when he sees that his child has become independent and can walk the paths of life unaccompanied, then he becomes like Joseph, who always knew that his child was not his own but had merely been entrusted to his care."

The pope added: "In every exercise of our fatherhood, we should always keep in mind that it has nothing to do with possession, but it is rather a 'sign' pointing to a greater fatherhood. In a way, we are all like Joseph: a shadow of the heavenly Father, who 'makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust' (Matthew 5:45). And a shadow that follows his Son."

At his general audience on March 18 this year, he urged Catholics to turn to St. Joseph in times of adversity. "In life, at work and within the family, through joys and sorrows, he always sought and loved the Lord, deserving the Scriptures' eulogy that described him as a just and wise man," he said. "Always invoke him, especially in difficult times, and entrust your life to this great saint."

The pope concludes his new apostolic letter with a prayer to St. Joseph, urging Catholics to pray to St. Joseph for "... the grace of graces: our conversion."

"Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted His only Son;
In you Mary placed her trust;
With you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us, too, show yourself a father,
And guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
And defend us from every evil. Amen."



. . . and suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.”

And it came to pass, as the angels were gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said one to another, “Let us now go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord hath made known unto us.”

“And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told” (Luke 2:13-20).

Glory to God! The shepherds heard the message, acted on it, and shared it with anyone who would listen. Our greatest opportunity at St. Francis School is to share the word of God with our students and to help them act on it.

This year, like no other, has been amazing!

- ◆ The classrooms K–6 are at capacity and, despite COVID restrictions, the students are happy to be in school.
- ◆ Our 2nd graders were able to receive First Reconciliation during school hours and are preparing for their First Eucharist.
- ◆ The middle school students produced cardinal virtues presentations reflecting on where virtuous behavior shows up in scripture, in literature, and in their personal lives.
- ◆ Preschool to 8th Grade will all be in-person in January.
- ◆ Annual giving campaign raised \$ 90,000—nearly doubling previous successes.
- ◆ Christmas basket fundraiser brought in more than \$800 to help parishioners in need.
- ◆ \$1,000 was donated for personal protective equipment from alumni families.
- ◆ More than \$22,000 in grants for childcare was secured from the State to keep Preschool and Childcare Programs running while class sizes have to be small.
- ◆ Auction plans are under way with a new business partnership and procurement system.

We remain ever hopeful that our virtual event will be accessed by family, friends, and alumni across the United States. We encourage you to share our invitation far and wide. Participants may join us on February 6, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. .

God has blessed us in your response to our request for assistance in sharing the Good News of salvation with our students. We remain always grateful!




