The National Eucharistic Congress: Part 1

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has launched a three-year, National Eucharistic revival initiative, culminating with a National Eucharistic Congress. Part of the impetus for the campaign was a Pew Research Center study in the fall of 2019 that showed just 30 to 40 percent of Catholics understand and believe in the Real Presence.

A more recent study conducted by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University found that 50 percent of Catholics know the teaching on the Real Presence in the Eucharist, and only 40 percent believe this teaching. The study also showed that only 15 percent of Catholics attend Sunday Mass on a weekly basis.

The first year was the diocesan revival. With the feast of Corpus Christi this year, we have begun the parish phase of the Eucharistic Revival. The National Eucharistic Congress—which will be held from July 17–21, 2024 in Indianapolis, Indiana—will be the culmination of the revival efforts, with a call to be sent out as missionaries. At this historic event, more than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis to reconsecrate their hearts to the source and summit of our faith. This momentous occasion is a milestone within the National Eucharistic Revival and a turning point for the Church in the U.S.

This will be the First National Eucharistic Congress in 83 Years. It is a pivotal moment in both American history and the legacy of the Catholic Church.

“At the National Eucharistic Congress, the Church will draw into a deeper intimacy with our Eucharistic Lord, allowing our eyes to be opened and our hearts to be set on fire with His love.”

The whole Congress will be an experience of prayer: a liturgical act offering the Catholic Church—with those in attendance in Indianapolis, as well as across the country—to the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit. This reconsecration will result in a massive outpouring of grace and renewed missionary sending as participants are moved to share the Eucharistic love of the Lord “for the life of the world” (John 6:51). “The only remedy I know to combat the spiritual indifference of our times is to surround it with fire, the fire of the Eucharist” said St. Peter Julian Eymard.

We know what happens when two or more are gathered in the Lord’s name—but what happens with 80,000? For the first time in a generation, the Church will gather to ask Jesus to breathe His life into our dry bones and then send us back to our community to share His love.

On July 16, 2024, all four branches of this historic Pilgrimage from four different parts of the country will converge in Indianapolis for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress—a milestone within the Revival and a historic moment for the Church in the United States. It will be a transformative experience that will bear fruit for generations to come.

Jesuit Volunteer EnCorps Program



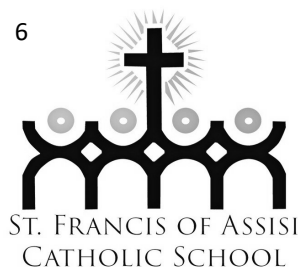
Would you like a chance to reflect on your volunteer experience with other involved volunteers? JV EnCorps may be for you. It is an ecumenical, faith-based program of JVC

The mission of Saint Francis of Assisi Catholic School is to educate the whole child in a Christ-centered community that values service, leadership, and academic excellence.

Our vision is to inspire academic scholars, motivated to serve with faith and moral character.

Did You Know? . . .

St. Francis is three schools in one.

We have an early childhood department containing preschool, prekindergarten and aftercare. This part of the school is licensed under the early learning division as a daycare.

The elementary department spans kindergarten through fifth grade. This department currently has seven classroom teachers, one aide, and several specialists that they share with the middle school.

The middle school department has six classroom teachers. It is split into subject areas rather than grade levels.

Our specialists teach Library, Religion, Spanish, Art, PE/Health, Garden, Music, STEM, and learning support. Fifth grade and middle school also have a Choral Band option.

Our nutrition specialist prepares lunches provided by Bend-LaPine and supervises the kitchen during lunch.

Our office is run by two part-time secretaries under the direction of the principal. We are fortunate to have a financial officer for bookkeeping and budgeting and a development officer to run our fundraising and recruitment/retention programs.
