



From the Pastor



Historic Church: Survey 4

I am very grateful to the 220 of you who responded to the survey on the Historic Church Restoration and Renovation. Of the 220 of you who responded, 50 of you (22.7%) chose Level 1, 79 (36%) chose Level 2, and 91 (41.3%) chose Level 3.

Most of you wrote in your comments and/or suggestions with your selection, and they are very much appreciated. They were insightful, thoughtful, and they are a great help in choosing a direction to proceed.

There were some questions and clarifications sought in your comments. My intent in writing these messages for the past three weeks is to address some of those concerns, and to give you as much information as I can. Making the decisions will be the task of the Historic Church Restoration and Renovation Committee with the assistance of the Parish Council and Finance Council—and, of course, under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

The stained-glass windows are precious. But, the lead holding each piece together is wearing out, and it will not be very long before it begins to fail. The outside glass that protects the stained glass needs replacement as well. They have become very cloudy, and a couple of them have fallen out due to winds. Each window needs to be taken to the studio and worked on—an expensive project that would cost more than \$400,000 for all of them together.

The focus of every church is the altar where the holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered. That is where Jesus becomes present—body and blood, soul and divinity. Jesus is at the center. As Catholics, Mary and Joseph would come next. The saints, who are our models and inspirations for living out the Gospel of Christ, come after that.

Building or renovating any worship space is a challenging but, at the same time, exciting time in the life of a parish. Even the smallest of renovations is an opportunity to renew the liturgical life of the community. The success of a building or renovation project is revealed in its effect on the liturgical life of the community:

“The People of God, gathered for Mass, has a coherent and hierarchical structure, which finds its expression in the variety of ministries and the variety of actions according to the different parts of the celebration. The general ordering of the sacred building must be such that in some way it conveys the image of the gathered assembly and allows the appropriate ordering of all the participants, as well as facilitating each in the proper carrying out of his function.” (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Paragraph 294*).

Building or renovating a Church should also be an opportunity to renew our faith. The renovation that we are talking about is a huge opportunity to deepen our faith and show its beauty and depth. It needs to lead us to a spiritual renewal. It needs to be faith-centered and not building-centered. “A church building participates in the sanctifying and redeeming action of God in the sacramental liturgy” (Can. 834 §1).

A Catholic church is a structure that symbolizes and embodies the presence of God in the local assembly. Every church project whether building or renovation is, therefore, an expression of the faith and vibrancy of the community.

Please remember all our efforts in your daily prayer. “Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain” (Psalm 127:1).

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK

Religious Freedom Week 2021 takes place from June 22 to 29.

The Week begins with the Feast of Sts. John Fisher and Thomas More, ends with the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, and includes the Feast of the Nativity of St John the Baptist. During Religious Freedom Week, Catholics are encouraged to pray, reflect and act each day for religious freedom. It aims to help Catholics build solidarity with people of faith who are persecuted abroad and find strength to carry out the mission of the Church here in the United States. THE THEME FOR this year is Solidarity in Freedom. The Church's promotion of religious freedom expresses her solidarity with all people who seek the good and who hope for fulfillment in the truth, which the Church teaches is ultimately found in Jesus Christ. "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community" (Fratelli tutti, 116). Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all.

The USCCB Committee for Religious Liberty has collaborated with the Office of International Justice and Peace to raise awareness about the persecution of Christians in different parts of the world. Domestically, a major area of concern continues to be freedom for Catholic institutions, such as schools, hospitals, and child welfare service providers, to carry out their missions with integrity. While the United States has suffered the effects of the COVID pandemic, Catholics have stepped in to serve. However, religious organizations' ability to partner with the government in its relief efforts and to receive needed government aid is continually threatened by legislative provisions that would exclude some faiths but not others.

The Equality Act represents a major threat to the Church's freedom to engage the public. It:

- exempts itself from the bipartisan Religious Freedom Restoration Act, in an explicit and unprecedented departure from one of America's founding principles, thereby infringing on religious freedom and making it more difficult for individuals to live out their faith.
- forces religiously operated spaces and establishments, such as church halls, to either host functions that violate their beliefs or close their doors to their communities.
- requires women to compete against men and boys in sports, and to share locker rooms and shower facilities with men and boys.
- forces faith-based charities that serve all people to violate their religious beliefs, and threatens the welfare of thousands of beneficiaries of charitable services such as shelters and foster care agencies, by forcing a multitude of them to be shut down.
- jeopardizes existing prohibitions on the use of federal taxpayer funds for abortion, likely pressuring or even mandating the performance of abortions by health care providers in violation of their consciences, and ultimately ending more human lives.
- hinders quality health care, by forcing health care professionals, against their best medical judgment, to support treatments and procedures associated with "gender transition." (USCCB) Learn more about the Equality Act at www.usccb.org/equality-act.

Another issue of special concern is the wave of attacks on Catholic churches that began in May of 2020. There have been over 60 attacks so far, and that number continues to grow. The precise reasons for these attacks are often unknown. In all cases, Catholics must remember that we worship the Lord who reveals the truth and beauty of the gospel in his suffering and resurrection, and that we are called to respond to aggression with compassion. Through prayer, education, and public action during Religious Freedom Week, we can promote the essential right of religious freedom for Catholics and for those of all faiths.


COVID-19 Vaccines
