The National Eucharistic Revival: The Parish Phase



t has been a year since the National Eucharistic Revival officially began on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, 2022. The Church dedicated this first year to Diocesan Revival—inviting diocesan bishops, priests, and staff to experience renewal in their own Eucharistic faith. It was a prayerful period of preparation and intercession as we anticipated the grassroots blossoming of the Revival movement and built a foundation for it to flourish.

We kicked off the diocesan revival with a Holy Hour. The entire diocese united in worshiping the Lord in the Eucharist. We had catechesis on the Eucharist each Sunday of Lent and a Holy Hour on the third Sunday of every other month. All the weekend Masses on the last Sunday of the month ended with benediction across the diocese. Many parishes in the diocese also had a Eucharistic procession on the feast of Corpus Christi.

We will continue these practices into the next phase of the Eucharistic Revival—the Parish Phase. On June 11th, with the feast of Corpus Christi, we kicked off the next phase of our revival journey—the Year of Parish Revival.

You can expect to see many more opportunities to participate in the Revival on the local level. The task of parishes in this Year of Parish Revival is to revive parishioners in their love with Jesus in the Eucharist and to send them forth to share this love with others.

Each parish will respond in a unique way to four key invitations: reinvigorate worship, create moments of personal encounter, engage in robust formation, and send Catholics forth as missionaries.

Here at St. Francis, we plan to invite Fr. Ricky Manalo to reinvigorate worship and better our participation in the Holy Eucharist. Fr. Manalo, CSP, Ph.D., is a Paulist Missionary Priest, composer for Oregon Catholic Press, theologian, and author. His most recent awards include the 2020 Distinguished Catholic Music Composer of the Year Award by the Association of Catholic Publishers and the 2018

Pastoral Musician of the Year Award by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians.

Fr. Manalo studied composition and piano at the Manhattan School of Music, theology at the Washington Theological Union, and Liturgy, Culture, and Sociology at the Graduate Theological Union (GTU) in Berkeley, CA. He currently resides at St. Paul the Apostle Church in New York City. He will conduct separate workshops for the congregation and the choir when he visits us in November.

To reinvigorate our participation in the Eucharist, I also plan to install a video wall at the 27th St. Church so that we do not need to bury our heads in the missalettes but, instead, listen to the readings, sing, and respond with our heads held high. A generous parishioner has donated \$50,000, and I am praying that one or more will step up with another \$50,000 to complete this project.

For moments of personal encounter, we have several opportunities in our parish such as the Eucharist twice each day, Eucharistic Adoration from 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday, Confessions, Men's and Women's groups, and prayer groups. ALPHA will also begin again this Fall. If you have not been to one, please plan to attend.

To engage in a robust formation, Bible Studies this year will focus on the Eucharist, and come Advent, we will continue the catechesis on the Eucharist at all weekend Masses. We will also have a parish-wide book study on the Eucharist. These will prepare us for the National Eucharistic Congress from July 17th to July 21st in Indianapolis where 80,000 people are expected to attend.

This will then lead us into the Jubilee Year of 2025, when I hope to organize a pilgrimage to the shrines of Italy—including Rome, Assisi, the San Giovani Rotondo, and Montecassino. In the coming weeks/months, I will be sharing more details about these plans as we enter this exciting year of grace.
