

From the Astor

Making Our Way to the Passion Play: Part 2

We stayed three nights and two days in Innsbruck. On May 18th, Wednesday, we had a leisurely walking tour of the town. We visited the magnificent Wilten Cathedral, the garden, and ended in front of the *Golden Roof*, a landmark structure located in the Old Town section, and considered the city's most famous symbol. Completed in 1500, the roof was decorated with 2,657 fire-gilded copper tiles for Emperor Maximilian I to mark his wedding to Bianca Maria Sforza. The Emperor and his wife used the balcony to observe festivals, tournaments, and other events that took place in the square below.

In the afternoon, we took a train ride through the beautiful countryside. At the end of the train ride, horse carriages were waiting to take us through the woods to our bus. It was my first time in a horse carriage, and those horses were very beautiful and elegant. The bus then took us to a restaurant where the chef was waiting for us to teach us how to make Austrian apple strudel. Four of us were volunteered by the rest of the group to help. Three of them helped to peel the apples, while I made the dough. We had to stop to listen to the chef when an apple flew across the room from one of the volunteer peelers. We all got to taste a slice of the delicious apple strudel. It was fun making it, and I can't wait to make it again. The evening was free and while I walked about the town, I found a group of people praying the rosary at the Marian Plaza beneath the statue of our Blessed Mother. I joined them for the rosary and asked if there was someone I could speak English with. There was one man who spoke English, and he explained to me that they gathered every Wednesday at 7 p.m. at the Marian Plaza to pray for their country. What a great thing to do!

On Thursday, May 19th, after Mass and breakfast, we set out for Salzburg. We began the walking tour at Mirabell Gardens. Some of the famous songs of *Sound of Music*, including "Do, Re, Me" were shot here. Now I can't wait to see the movie again. It is an amazing garden with imposing buildings, fountains and statues.

Then we set out for Getreidegasse, the birthplace of Mozart. We saw the place where he lived before he moved to Vienna. Then the afternoon was free for us to explore, and I went into the cathedral where Mozart was baptized and confirmed. It was there he learned to play the piano at the age of five. The pipe organ is huge and stunning. The day ended with dinner at the 1,200-year-old St. Peter's Restaurant—the oldest in Austria—and still owned by the monks.

On Friday, May 20th, after Mass and breakfast, we crossed the border into Bavaria, Germany. We checked into our hotel and headed to Oberammergau for the Passion Play which we all have been waiting for. We got there at 10:45 a.m. and walked about the village before having lunch at a restaurant close to the Passion Play Theatre. It's a beautiful village surrounded by the Bavarian Alps. This village has about 5,000 people and welcomes another 5,000 people each day of the Play. We were in line by 1:30 p.m. to get into the theatre to watch the play. I will dedicate my next week's column exclusively to the Passion Play.

The Play ended at 10:30 p.m., and we got back to the hotel at 11:30. Because it was a long night, we got up late, and after Mass and breakfast, we were on our way to Linderhof Palace built by King Ludwig II of Bavaria. Behind the Baroque facade is a Rococo world, rich in abundant gold ornamentation with many sculptural elements showing workmanship of incomparable artistic quality. Then on our way to Fussen, we stopped to take pictures of Neuschwanstein Castle, one that King Ludwig II could not complete.


And then, there in the parking lot, was my cousin, Fr. Saji, waiting to pick me up to take me to take his place. So I said "good-bye" to the rest of the group.

My cousin takes care of six churches within a distance of 10 miles. Having six churches within 10 miles is something unthinkable for us here. They are small towns with houses surrounded by farms, and with a church in the middle of the town. Most farms cultivate grass/hay for cattle, and they harvest about six times before winter sets in. I visited all his churches, and they are all of stunning beauty—with elaborate gold ornamentations.

While staying with my cousin, I visited the city of Munich with its beautiful churches. The botanical garden in town is very attractive with every type of plant from all over the world. The Olympic Tower that takes you up 197 meters gives you a 360-degree bird's-eye view of the town, including the 1972 Olympics arena. As I was now in Bayern State, I had to visit the Bavarian Motor Works (BMW) show room as well. There were amazing cars on display, but I decided not to buy one because I didn't had enough credit on my credit card.

On Friday morning, my cousin dropped me at the airport in Munich to catch my flight back to the U.S. There is nothing like being back home! (See a few photos on p. 4.)
