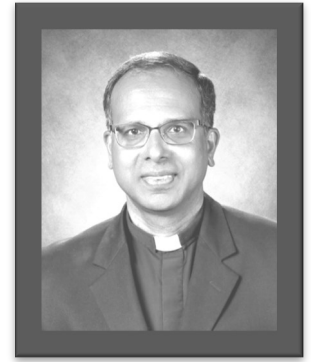

D From the Pastor



Knowing and Living the Spirit of Lent

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. It is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter.

During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Through its two-fold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. The baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment, as others prepare to be baptized through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics. The catechumens are led to the sacraments of initiation by means of the rite of election, the scrutinies and catechesis.

During Lent, it is not permitted to decorate the altar with flowers, and the use of musical instruments is allowed only so as to support the singing. Nevertheless, Laetare Sunday (the fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities and Feasts are exceptions to this rule. Those preparing liturgical celebrations need to attend to the purpose rather than the strict letter of this law. All memorials of saints occurring during Lent are observed as optional. Hence, they are omitted or observed as commemorations. Lenten weekdays are not commemorated on Solemnities and Feasts. Ash Wednesday and the days of Holy Week take precedence over all Solemnities and Feasts. Alleluia is not sung or said from the beginning of Lent until the Easter Vigil.

If marriages are to take place during Lent, the wedding party needs to respect the special nature of

this liturgical season and should refrain from too much pomp or display. The readings for the Lenten Masses are chosen in relation to the themes of baptismal renewal and penance. The gospels and the readings from the Hebrew Scriptures have been selected for their mutual relationship.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, there is a special prayer over the people just before the final blessing. They are obligatory or optional depending on the day. The two Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation are appropriate and recommended for use during the season of Lent. I will be using these on all Sundays of Lent and also on some weekdays.

Instead of the Nicene Creed, especially during Lent and Eastertime, the baptismal symbol of the Roman Church, known as the Apostles' Creed, is recommended. We will be reciting the Apostles' Creed on all Sundays of Lent and Easter. It is found on page 10 of *Breaking Bread*.

All Votive Masses, such as the Sacred Heart of Jesus on First Fridays and the Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturdays are not to be celebrated in Lent and Eastertime.

The purpose of the first part of Lent is to bring us to compunction. It is meant "to puncture" our inflated egos, a challenge to any self-deceit about the quality of our lives as disciples of Jesus. The Gospel passages are taken from the Synoptics (Mathew, Mark and Luke) and the Old Testament readings are chosen accordingly the first three and a half weeks of Lent. These readings are meant to trouble us, to confront our illusions about ourselves, and bring home to us our radical need of salvation. In answer to this profound awareness of need, the Gospel readings in the second part of Lent shift from Synoptics to John. It is a shift from the demands of discipleship to the person of Jesus Christ. John presents to us Jesus as the Savior. However, Jesus can only save those who know their need of salvation. Confronted with our weakness and powerlessness, we come to Him for our salvation.

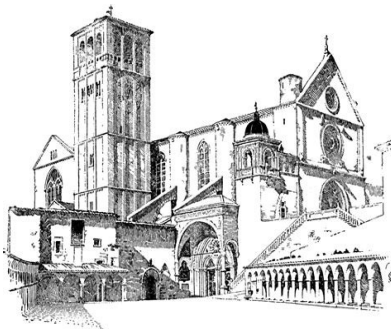

Guidelines for Lent 2025

Lent prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. It is a time for reflection and spiritual renewal—a time to examine one's relationship with God and with others. Lent is also the final preparation period for catechumens seeking to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. As Catholics, the Church calls us to a spirit of repentance and conversion—"to turn away from sin, and to be faithful to the Gospel."



Through our traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we express our conversion and prepare to renew our Baptismal promises at Easter.

Below are the Church's definitions of "fasting and abstinence," as well as the obligatory minimum requirements that she asks of us.

- **Abstinence: Meat and poultry are removed from our meals—fish is acceptable.**
- **Fasting: Eat one full meal and two smaller meals—no snacking during the day.**
- **All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**
- **All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from meat and poultry on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.**
