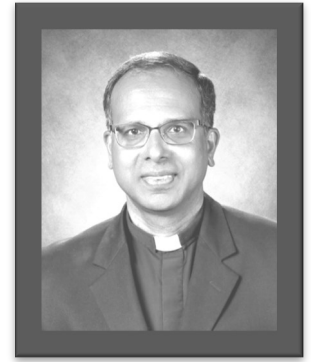

From the **P**astor



Attention Follows Motion, Not Sound

I am sure you have heard this before: “Attention follows motion, not sound.” This is something that Bishop repeated many times during his training of liturgical ministers.

Once a presenter asked his audience to hold up their thumb and place that under their chin while he himself placed it under his nose. The majority of those present in the audience did what he did and not what he said. It demonstrates that we tend to follow actions more than words. It is true in every sphere of life.

Words and actions are an integral part of liturgy. Actions and Words provide a clear understanding of the liturgical action so that the spirit of the faithful may reach toward the salvation extended through Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

Words and actions make present what is celebrated in mystery in liturgy. The words explain the meaning of the action. Pay attention next time when you are at Mass or at other liturgical celebrations. Pay attention to what the priest says when he places his hands over the bread and wine, when he holds them, when he washes his fingers, when he offers the bread and wine, when he pours water to baptize someone, when he gives the white cloth to the newly baptized, when he gives the lighted candle, or when he anoints the candidate.

The Conciliar Constitution *Sacrosanctum Concilium* defines sacred liturgy as “the exercise of the priestly function of Jesus Christ,” in which “the sanctification of man is signified through sensible signs and realized in the manner proper to each one of them” (n. 7). In the sacramental life of the Church, the “treasure hidden in the field,” of which Jesus speaks in the Gospel parable (Matthew 13:44), is made perceptible to the faithful through sacred signs. Recognizing that “human nature is such that it does not come easily to meditation of divine things without external devices,” the Church “uses lights, incense, vestments, and many other elements transmitted by the Apostolic teaching and tradition, which put in evidence the majesty of such a great Sacrifice [the Holy Mass], and the minds of

the faithful are attracted by these visible signs of religion and piety, to the contemplation of lofty things, which are hidden in this Sacrifice” (Council of Trent, Session XXII, 1562, *Doctrina de ss. Missae Sacrificio*, c. 5, DS 1746).

“As a social being, man needs signs and symbols to communicate with others, through language, gestures, and actions. The same holds true for his relationship with God” (CCC, n. 1146). Jesus himself made use of signs in His earthly ministry and gave them a new meaning—above all in the institution of the Eucharist.

The Lord Jesus took the bread, broke it and gave it to His Apostles, thus carrying out a gesture that corresponds to a profound truth and expresses it in a sentient way. The sacramental signs, which were developed in the Church under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, continue this work of sanctification and, at the same time, “prefigure and anticipate the glory of heaven” (CCC, n. 1152).

As our attention is drawn more easily to motion than to words, our liturgical celebrations can have greater effectiveness if we can avoid all unnecessary movements during liturgical celebrations, like walking to your pew or out of your pew when all are seated, while the Word of God is being proclaimed, or when all are kneeling.

If you are late or need to walk up to your pew or leave your pew, look for a break in the liturgical action, like when all are standing in between the readings, or when there is a movement in the assembly, like taking up the collection, or at the time of Communion.

All instructions and unnecessary movements in the sanctuary must be avoided as much as possible during the liturgical celebrations—and even before the celebration, when people are present.

Thanks for your attention in these matters so that all of us can experience the full effect of our liturgical celebrations.

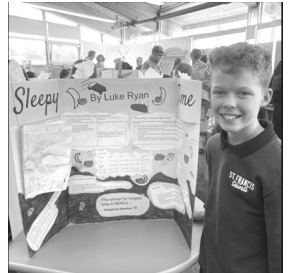
