



From the Pastor



Making Disciples: Part 4

A vision is the key to our Mission to make disciples for Christ. Jesus operated out of his vision. His vision guided his ministry (Mark 1:35-39). A vision lays down a clear picture. It calls for positive change. Church attendance is on the decline, people with no religious affiliations has increased 13% in the last decade. People who call themselves Christians declined 12% in the last 10 years. We are seeing people burning out, many young families show up at Church only to receive sacraments for their children; 75% of the congregation do not contribute financially to the Church etc. So, being where we are is not an option. We have to go somewhere else. A vision helps to understand where we are going. It is future-oriented. God is taking us somewhere. As did many in our visioning group, I, too, spent time in prayer to write down my dream for St. Francis Parish. Here it is:

I dream of a St. Francis Parish that everybody in the neighborhood and in the Diocese talks about, not because it looks like a spaceship, but because it is a place that everyone—sinners and saints—find it to be a beacon of hope and a light to the community. It is a place where people in Bend, and in its outlying areas, can encounter Christ together and in one another. I dream of a parish where people feel safe enough to share their struggles with one another, and loved enough to discern in what way God is calling them to use their gifts.

I'd love to see a Sunday Mass where people are proud to invite their friends. I look forward to a parish that has a culture of invitation, where parishioners are neither afraid nor ashamed to invite others to our church. I imagine a day when parishioners' family or friends visiting from out of town will say, "We can hit the slopes or go fishing later—but let's first go to Mass at St. Francis."

I dream of a Sunday morning where people have the same sense of anticipation and excitement approaching the church as they do going to dinner with friends or to a concert. I want to see St. Francis as a beehive of activities with various ministries that we don't have enough space for, so that we need to build the parish hall. I'd like to see a parish hall where 500 people can sit down for a wedding reception, funeral reception, or any other celebration. I'd love to see everyone greeted at the door by familiar faces as they walk in, where people are excited

to come in to meet their friends, and meet Christ in the Eucharist. I'd love to see a "welcome kiosk" as people come in. I'd love to see coffee and refreshments after every Mass, giving the parishioners an opportunity to stay back after the Mass and enjoy fellowship.

I'd wish a liturgy where the readers make the Word of God come alive, where the homilies are inspiring and engaging, where the music is uplifting and transcendent. I imagine video screens that help people engage all their senses, and enable people to participate without burying their noses in the missalettes.

I hope for a Sunday Mass that has joyful people singing and praying, worshipping God. I'd love to see active youth ministries and summer camps in the parish where young people have a safe place to hang out, engage in fun activities, and grow in faith. I hope to see a parish where all its members—not just 20%—support the church financially, according to what God has blessed them with.

I'd love to see St. Francis become a cradle of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. I'd love to see a parish where everyone is actively engaged in deepening their Catholic faith.

I look forward to a St. Francis where children can be in a self-supported parish school from Pre-K–12th, where parents do not have to worry about finding another school. I envision a school where each grade has at least 20 students. I look forward to a parish and school where entire families are brought into authentic encounters with Jesus and are engaged with their time and talents in activities of the Church so that no future parents and grandparents have to lament their children walking away from their faith. I'd love to see a parish where the relevance of faith and how it impacts their families and relationships is obvious to everyone, where everyone is empowered to boldly talk about faith, and how Jesus has touched their lives. I'd love to see a parish that reaches out to the Bend community and is much involved in reaching out to the poor and needy.

Ultimately, I dream of a parish that is healthy, lively, and growing, not because we have vibrant liturgies and preaching or interesting youth programs or social justice initiatives, but because people are brought to Christ.

—Update on Two Pro-Life Bills—



Despite heavy input from the public in favor of passing two pro-life bills, the Born-Alive Infants Protection Act (SB 1553), and the Abortion Pill Reversal Informed Consent Bill (HB 4042) both died in committee without a vote or any discussion. SB 1553 would have

established a legal requirement to provide life-saving care for infants that survived an attempted abortion.

Please investigate these two bills so that you will be informed about what has become law in Oregon when it comes to the lack of protection for the unborn.

The good news here was the enormous input from the public in favor of passing these laws, giving evidence to what is being reported in many national polls; that through the years, the American public has become more and more pro-life. Please continue to pray for the unborn, those at the end of their natural lives, and the State of Oregon.




