



From the Pastor



The Holy Week

HOLY WEEK IS the most sacred time of the liturgical year. It commemorates and remembers the last week of Jesus' life on this earth. These are the days leading up to the great feast of Easter. We begin the Holy Week today with **Palm Sunday**, which commemorates Our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where he was welcomed by crowds.

Due to the peculiar times we are living in, you are invited to take a palm with you as you enter the Church and take your seat. The palms are blessed at the beginning of the Mass, after which the Mass is celebrated. The other notable feature of the present Palm Sunday service is the reading of the Gospel of the Passion by three readers.

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

On **Holy Thursday**, we reenact the Lord's Last Supper, which He shared with His apostles on the night He was betrayed and arrested. The only Mass celebrated on this day is at 7 p.m. This is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the entire liturgical year. The bell will be rung at the *Gloria*, and then the Church bells will go silent until we sing the *Gloria* again at the Easter Vigil. This year there will be no washing of feet at Mass, but I invite each of you to wash the feet of one another in your household. This, I promise, will be a powerful moment of healing and strengthening of the family bonds. This is also the night Jesus instituted the Mass (Eucharist) and the ministerial priesthood.

The celebration of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday will transition into Adoration. Because the St. Claire chapel is too small, we will not transfer the Eucharist to the chapel this year. Instead, it will be placed on the altar of the church, and you are

invited to spend a holy hour in adoration.

On **Good Friday**, the day of the crucifixion and death of our Lord, we have Stations of the Cross and the veneration of the Cross. We will accompany Jesus as He makes His final journey to Mt. Calvary by doing the Stations of the Cross at the 27th St. Church—preferably outside, weather permitting.

There will be a bilingual Stations of the Cross in the Historic Church at 12 Noon. Then the Stations will conclude with a recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3 p.m. The Liturgy of the Cross will start at 7 p.m. in the 27th St. Church.

Holy Saturday is a vigil. We keep watch for the expectant rising of Our Savior. This was the day He went down into the netherworld in order to bring back up with Him into heaven those who had died before His coming. Up to this time, the gates to heaven were closed, and no one could go there because of the original sin of Adam. Jesus changed all that. By paying the price for our sins on the Cross, He gained for us our eternal salvation, and heaven was opened once more. Also on this night, those who have spent months of preparation will be received through the sacraments of initiation and full communion into the Catholic Church for the first time. It is a joyous occasion, and the Easter Vigil liturgy is the most beautiful liturgy.

The Triduum is an intense immersion into the fundamental mystery of what it is to be a Christian. During these days, we suffer with Christ so that we might rise with Him at His glorious Resurrection.

Holy Week is a time to clear our schedules of unnecessary activities. Make it a priority to attend all the liturgies of the Holy Week. In it we celebrate the greatest events of our own salvation. Those who are unable to join us in person are welcome to join the livestream at stfrancisbend.org. May the celebration of the Holy Week be a time of abundant blessings for you and for our parish family.




The mission of St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School is to educate the whole child in a Christ-centered community that values service, leadership, and academic excellence.

Faith Formation

Confirmation 2021: Students preparing to receive Confirmation in 2021 should be (1) Giving at least 10 hours of service to the community—neighbors, church, (2) Researching a saint and writing a short paragraph, (3) Meeting with their sponsors either in person or virtual to complete the 4 workshops, (4) Getting familiar with the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit and twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit, and (5) writing a letter to Bishop Cary, explaining how you carried out and grew in faith from the last four points.

RCIA and Sacrament Preparation for Adults (age 18 and older): This is the class for Baptized Catholic adults who never received 1st Communion and/or Confirmation, and for unbaptized adults or baptized non-Catholic adults wishing to be received into the Catholic Faith. We do weekly homework and then come together every Thursday night on ZOOM.
