

From the Pastor



Splendid India Tour 3

From Dhobi Khana, we drove over to watch Kathakali, a traditional form of classical Indian dance—one of the oldest theater forms still practiced—and very unique to the State of Kerala. It combines devotion, drama, dance, music, costumes, and makeup into a divine experience for the viewers. It retells the great stories of the past, mostly from Indian epics, and leaves one spellbound at the various intricacies involved in the performance. Every single quiver of the lips, flicker of the eyes, or a movement involving the fingers twirling, has great significance. The entire performance sees the audience unable to take their eyes away from the spectacle taking place on stage. The costumes are elaborate and the faces painted in vivid hues. We arrived early to watch the elaborate makeup. At our entrance we were given the story that they intended to communicate using this classical dance. After watching the Kathakali performance, we went to the hotel, had dinner, and retired to our rooms to rest.

The next morning, we checked out of the hotel and made our way to Munnar, a hill station 4,000 feet above sea level. It is known for its tea and spice plantations. On our way we had a spice plantation tour and an opportunity to purchase spices. Right next to it was available an elephant ride, but no one was bold enough to take a ride. All gathered around to take pictures though. Then we continued our journey to Munnar, which is a town in the Western Ghats Mountain Range in India's State of Kerala. A hill station and former resort for the British Raj elite, it's surrounded by rolling hills dotted with tea plantations established in the late 19th Century. We stopped at a tea-processing plant to see how various types of tea are processed and then at a local vegetable market to see the locally grown vegetables. At the end of a long day, we checked into a hotel with a majestic view of the tea gardens.

The next day we made our way to Kumorakom on the shore of Vembanad Lake, the largest body of backwater and the longest lake in India, as well as the largest in the State of Kerala. The lake has an area of 193 square miles and a maximum length of 60 miles, spanning several districts. It took five hours to drive from Munnar to get there, and then we had a serene boat ride on the lake for a couple of hours, having also our lunch on the boat.

After the relaxing boat ride, we checked into our last hotel which was right on the lake. And it being a

Sunday, I celebrated Mass for the group, we had dinner, and then retired to our rooms to rest.

The next day we left the hotel after breakfast to visit my family and hometown. I was looking forward to this day. As we approached my family home, one of the “miracle twins,” 3-year-old Anna, walked right into our midst looking as though she knew us her entire life. Whereas her twin sister, Maria, stayed with her Mom looking at the strange faces. It took a little while for her to warm up to us. My brother had a coconut ready for each of us. Soon we were all drinking coconut water using a straw inserted through a little hole in the coconut. Then he cut open the coconuts and scooped out the flesh for us to eat. Everyone was welcomed to walk through the house to see it and how a typical family lives here in Kerala. I was the “tour guide” for the day, so I explained everything and showed the room that I stay in when I'm on a family visit.

We walked over to my oldest brother's house for a tour of his home and for lunch. We walked down a few yards to watch how coconut trees are tapped to get “toddy,” an alcoholic drink extracted from coconut trees. It was something that nobody had seen or known about. Toddy is extracted from the flowers of coconut trees before they open up. We were all given a cup of the toddy—a very refreshing drink with very little alcohol when consumed fresh from the tree. It ferments and becomes more alcoholic in a few hours. The coconut trees were surrounded by rice fields where I explained the rice cultivation over there. My family rice field was very close to it. Then on our way back to my brother's house, he demonstrated how to tap a rubber tree for the “milk” and how it's processed to produce rubber.

Lunch included several courses, including *appam* (a thin pancake made with fermented rice batter and coconut milk), chicken stew, fish, Kerala bananas, and ice cream. After lunch, the women were given the opportunity to learn how to wear a Sari, the traditional dress that women wear in India, and a Salwar Kameez (a pair of trousers and a tunic). Several ladies preferred to wear the latter as that doesn't require much learning. They were assisted by my sister-in-law and niece, Surabhi. The men were taught to wear a Kurta and Dhoti. The men and women all looked very stunning in their Indian outfits!


Taize




