



From the Pastor



St. Joseph: Terror of Demons—Part 1

Saint Joseph is known for many virtues. His *Litany* provides a succinct list of them and we have been focusing on one of his virtues every month. This month we reflect on one virtue and title for which St. Joseph is perhaps lesser known: “Terror of demons.” This title may well help us all to understand his particular patronage over the universal Church as well as his personal protection for all of us. If we were to consider St. Joseph in his familial context, we see him with Jesus and Mary. They were sinless and so the demons had no real power over them. We know that Jesus faced temptations as recorded by the gospels. If so, we can be sure Mary and Joseph, too, faced temptations. Joseph was an ordinary person like any one of us. He was neither God nor immaculately conceived.

Mary and Joseph overcame the tempter every time because of their heroic practice of virtues. Besides, he was the earthly father of Jesus. He cared for Jesus and Mary. He was the head of the household. Mary and Jesus honored the head of their household.

“Jesus and Mary bent their whole wills to Joseph’s, for he was the head of the Holy Family, but they lovingly surrendered their hearts to him as well.”

—*St. Peter Julian Eymard.*

As the protector of God’s family, he mastered all vices. His self-mastery terrorized demons. Therefore, St. Joseph is considered terrifying to the demons: even though he was not God, like Jesus, and even though he was not conceived without sin, like Mary.

The head of every household, like St. Joseph, needs to strive after self-mastery. That is what is going to prevent evil from having any access to your household. Self-mastery is nothing but

saying “no” to vice and saying “yes” to virtue. The Devil always attacks the head first. If the head of the household falls victim to the Devil’s temptations, then he has obtained a foothold in the family. He then makes his way to the rest of the members of the family.

Therefore, the responsibility that God has placed on the head of every household is huge. A demon is terrified of a head who practices virtue and strives after self-mastery. The virtue of self-mastery is for everyone. Every time we say “no” to a demon’s temptation, we have overcome the tempter and advanced in self-mastery.

Joseph is terrifying to those evil spirits who wish to devour souls in sin. This was particularly important for him as he fulfilled his important mission as head of the Holy Household, and he remains so as he protects the household of God, which is the Church. It is interesting to note, then, that since Blessed Pius IX declared St. Joseph the Patron and Protector of the Universal Church in 1870, the Church has not ceased to be persecuted and tried in one form or another. Such trials were, in fact, one of the reasons Blessed Pius took the step to elevate St. Joseph to such a lofty patronage. Then just a few years later, Leo XIII would take up his pen to write once again about devotion to St. Joseph during his own time of ecclesial and social distress.

Today, too, as the Church undergoes her latest share in the Passion of Christ, St. Joseph is lauded once again as our Holy Patron and Protector. This has taken the form of a “Year of St. Joseph” that Pope Francis began on December 8, 2020. St. Joseph shines forth again as the “Terror of Demons,” ready to protect the Bride of Christ from the evil spirits who wish to bring harm to Christ’s faithful.

St. Francis middle school students have the opportunity to participate in Spring Track and Field sports during March. We have 30 student athletes.


Practices are happening on our field immediately after school. Please use caution, and follow the posted speed limits if you are at the property from 2:30 to 5 p.m. Go Saints!

COVID Protocols Still In Place

1. All students/teachers wear masks unless eating.
2. All classes maintain six-foot distant seating.

5. Janitorial staff and daily cleaning schedule has been increased.
6. Adult access is limited and visitors are recorded for contact-tracing purposes.
7. Travel quarantine advisory requirements enforced.
8. Student Masses remain closed to the public.
9. Shouting and singing are restricted to outdoors.
