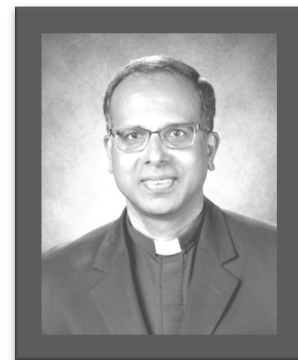

D From the Pastor



Lent Is Here . . .

We have just begun the season of Lent with the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. It has been five years since the outbreak of the Corona virus pandemic. The fact is that there are still about 20% of parishioners who used to attend church but who have not returned. There are others who used to be very regular who now attend occasionally. During this season of Lent, please join me to pray for their return to Mass. I am sure you may know a few of them. Keep them on your heart, and every time you come to Mass, please remember to pray for their return. We continue to livestream weekend Masses for the sake of those who are sick and homebound and cannot get to church. However, attending Mass online does not fulfill the Sunday obligation.

Lent is a journey accompanying Jesus into the desert fasting, praying, and almsgiving. Remember to find some extra time for prayer and penance during this season to focus on what this season is all about. Try going to a weekday Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, the Stations of the Cross, reading the Scriptures daily, and spending some time in personal prayer. Have a special jar on your dining table this season of Lent to put your savings in from the sacrifices you make every day of Lent, and then when Easter comes, give the savings for the benefit of the needy.

Bishop Liam Cary will present a Parish Lenten Mission on Wednesday and Thursday, March 18th and 19th, at 3:30 p.m., in English; and on Thursday, March 20th, at 6:30 p.m., in Spanish. You do not want to miss out on these days of special blessings.

I invite all the men of our parish to sign up for the Men's Conference, which will be here on Saturday, April 5th, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The theme of Lenten observance for us this year is "Lord, I am not worthy . . ." the words of the Centurion from the Gospel of Mathew 8:8. Lent provides us with the unique opportunity to reflect on our unworthiness and seek God's mercy. The words of the Centurion expressing his unworthiness to have Jesus come to his home to heal his servant are the same words that we say at Mass just before receiving the Holy Communion. Acknowledging our

unworthiness is the first step toward God's mercy. We will continue the practice of ending the last weekend Masses of each month with Benediction to grow in our love and devotion to the Eucharist.

You should have received by now my Lenten letter with the details of all that St. Francis offers this Lent and Holy Week. I pray that you will attend all of those events planned for this Lent.

Catholics have traditionally expressed sorrow for sin and the desire to live as genuine Disciples of Christ through the three traditional Lenten disciplines of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer. These Lenten disciplines will prepare you to receive the grace of Easter. These disciplines are aimed at purifying and transforming our lives to help us rise with Christ to the challenges of self-giving love.

Fasting is the most powerful spiritual discipline of all Christian disciplines. Through fasting and prayer, the Holy Spirit can transform our lives. Fasting is one of the most neglected spiritual practices today. Yet, it is the most effective means to get rid of our stubborn evil inclinations, obsessions and habits. It is a great tool to self-discipline. Jesus Himself fasted and taught His disciples to fast. Fasting is a time when we abstain from food or other pleasures and take the time to focus on God. Denying ourselves something physical to glorify God and enter into a deeper relationship with Him is the spirit of fasting. It is a way to demonstrate that we are serious about our relationship with God and that He comes first.

The Church requires us to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. As per the Church guidelines, anyone over the age of 18, but under the age of 60, should eat only one full meal on those days. The Church also invites us to practice abstinence. It means anyone 14 years or older must abstain from meat on all Fridays. The USCCB allows substitution of some other forms of penance for abstinence on all of the Fridays of the year, except the Fridays in Lent. I pray for a grace-filled Lenten journey for you, your family, and for our parish community.

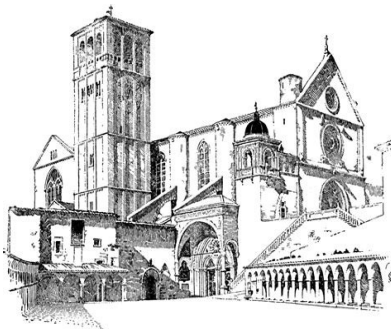

Guidelines for Lent 2025

Lent prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ’s suffering, death, and resurrection. It is a time for reflection and spiritual renewal—a time to examine one’s relationship with God and with others. Lent is also the final preparation period for catechumens seeking to be baptized at the Easter Vigil.

As Catholics, the Church calls us to a spirit of repentance and conversion—“to turn away from sin, and to be faithful to the Gospel.”

Through our traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we express our conversion and prepare to renew our Baptismal promises at Easter.

Below are the Church’s definitions of “fasting and abstinence,” as well as the obligatory minimum requirements that she asks of us.

- **Abstinence: Meat and poultry are removed from our meals—fish is acceptable.**
- **Fasting: Eat one full meal and two smaller meals—no snacking during the day.**
- **All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**
- **All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from meat and poultry on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.**
