



From the Pastor



The Freedom of the Spirit

Pentecost, also called “Whitsunday,” is a major feast in the Church, celebrated on the Sunday that falls on the 50th day of Easter. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and other disciples following the Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ (Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 2), and it marks the beginning of the Church.

The Greek word *pentekoste* means “fiftieth.” In the Old Testament, Pentecost was a harvest festival for the grain harvest celebrated 50 days after the Feast of Passover. This is known as the Feast of Weeks or the Feast of Harvest (Deuteronomy 16: 9–11). Among modern Jews, it is called *Shavuot*.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (Paragraphs 731–732) says: “On the day of Pentecost when the seven weeks of Easter had come to an end, Christ’s Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of his fullness, Christ, the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance. On that day, the Holy Trinity is fully revealed. Since that day, the Kingdom announced by Christ has been open to those who believe in him: in the humility of the flesh and in faith, they already share in the communion of the Holy Trinity. . . .”

When the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples, they immediately began proclaiming the Gospel. In fact, three thousand people were baptized that day. The disciples, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, were answering Jesus’ call to “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” (Matthew 28:19). The Holy Spirit is vital in the mission and witness of the Church; therefore we consider Pentecost to be the birthday of the Church.

Pentecost is not only an historical event. As the fulfillment of Jesus’ promise, it continues to bear fruit in the Church today, especially in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

Please pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on our parish. The Spirit truly sets us free. After being shut down or restricted by COVID-19 regulations for over a year, we are now looking forward to unre-

stricted worship. The CDC and the State of Oregon have lifted the mask and social distancing requirements in most places for those who are vaccinated.

Therefore, following the guidance of our bishop (*see Bishop Cary’s letter on page 4*), everyone is now free to be in church without a mask and/or social distancing—if you are vaccinated. (Of course, you are free to wear a mask if you feel the need for it.)

The ministers no longer need to wear masks when exercising a ministry. We will start taking up offertory collections, and resume offertory processions as before. The church facility is opened for meetings and other events starting in June. However, you may need to take the precautions that you believe are necessary to feel safe.

The celebration of Mass will return to the way we have been used to before COVID-19, starting on **Tuesday, June 1st**. However, the 7 a.m. Mass on Monday through Friday, and the 8 a.m. Mass on Saturday will continue to be in the main church a little while longer.

The **4:30 p.m. Mass on Sunday** will move to the Historic Church starting on **June 13th**.

Confessions will continue to be heard in the Faith Development rooms for a few more months, and we will continue to livestream all the Masses from the main church also for a while longer.

We have scheduled trainings for ministers so that they can be prepared to return to their regular duties. Thanks for all your continued patience. We should be fully back to normal soon.



Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of Your love.

Send forth Your Spirit, and they shall be created.

You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that, by the same Holy Spirit, we may be truly wise, and ever enjoy His consolations, through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace in the Risen Lord.

Some months ago, Governor Kate Brown took note of the Supreme Court’s decisive interventions to undo state and city restrictions on church gatherings throughout the nation. The new legal climate, the Governor acknowledged, led her to change her “orders” about churches to “recommendations” that were not legally enforceable.

This week she did away with most of the orders as well in the wake of new CDC guidance on 13 May, which does not require fully vaccinated people to wear a mask or physically distance in most public places, including churches.

In light of these developments, it is time to do away with diocesan safety precautions mandated for our parishes a year ago (30 April 2020). With this letter they are officially abrogated.

In particular, it is no longer necessary to maintain social distancing or encourage the wearing of facemasks. Of course, people are free to attend church with masks on; but those who serve in a public role at Mass are not to wear masks: priests, deacons, acolytes, altar servers, readers, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, greeters.

Measures to shorten the time for Mass are no longer necessary. Entrance and exit processions should take place. Ushers should take up the Collection and bring it forward to the priest in the Offertory procession. Choirs should sing as before, and the people should join them.

Missalettes should return to the pews, and parish bulletins to the vestibules; but volunteers need no longer sanitize pews between Masses. Priests, deacons, and Eucharistic ministers are not to use hand sanitizer in the sanctuary before and after giving Holy Communion. (Eucharistic ministers may do so in the pew before coming forward, but not in the sanctuary.)

As we take up our normal way of worship once again, let us be mindful especially of the people of India, who continue to suffer the ravages of COVID-19. May our good God restore good health to them as He has so kindly done for us.


