

Celebrating Pentecost in the Midst of Covid-19

The world is in the midst of COVID-19. In many dioceses across the world, churches are shut and others, like ours, are beginning to reopen with many restrictions. It is not Church as usual. We do not know for sure when we will get there. The aftermath of the novel coronavirus will form our society and world for years to come. Some, in the scientific community, caution us against doing too much too soon. They talk of a second wave. So there is fear and a lot of unknowns. We worry about those who are sick and their caregivers and healthcare workers. I am concerned about the health and wellbeing of all—especially those in our parish—St. Francis.

This is where the Feast of Pentecost can give us the strength we need. The disciples, along with Mary, were practicing “social distancing”—staying away from the crowd out of fear. They were locked together in fear in a small room, doors locked and windows tightly shut. They were afraid that they, too, would be killed in the light of Jesus’ death. Our world is much like that room now. Technology is one of our lifelines. It may well be the Holy Spirit’s way of increasing hope in these days of isolation. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak and to console—even online.

The coming of the Holy Spirit transformed the disciples. It removed from them their fear, and filled them with courage and hope for the future. He led them out of that room of fear to the ends of the earth, beginning from Jerusalem. The apostles’ sudden passionate preaching released the Holy Spirit’s refreshing message, and its invigorating warmth established the Church, which still stands today. The power of the Spirit that the apostles received is stunning—the gift of speaking in tongues. At Pentecost, with that gift of tongues, the apostles reversed the confusion of Babel. To the hearers’ astonishment and amazement, the inflamed apostles could be easily understood in their respective languages as they proclaimed the mighty acts of God through Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit gives each believer a different gift to share. It is not one of fear but boldness in Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit desires the best for us, to become men and women of sincere hope. The Holy Spirit provides the freedom to live with courage. Pentecost once again reminds us to ask for everything we need to love and serve one another and the people who need God. In the wake of this pandemic, Pentecost will be our blueprint of hope as we leave our rooms of fear, and enter the world again with faith and love. The 11 disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. There Jesus appeared to them and said, “All power in heaven and earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”

The Holy Spirit gives us the boldness to accomplish this mission. He removes from us all fear, and sets each of us on fire so that we can ignite the world with the fire of God’s love.

GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

All Masses will be celebrated in the 27th Street Church, limited to 25 people per Mass, including the presider and any other ministers.

Weekend Mass Schedule:

- Saturday: 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. (Spanish)
- Sunday: 7:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 4:30 p.m., and 12:30 p.m. (Spanish)
- Daily Mass: 7:00 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. (Monday–Friday), and 8:00 a.m. (Saturday)

Seating:

- We have blocked off the pews that are not available for seating, and we will strictly observe social distancing guidelines—including no exchange of peace during Mass, and no handshaking before and after Mass.
- People who are isolating together in the same household may attend Mass together and sit together without the 6' distancing requirement. However, there must be 6' between that family unit and the next nearest person.
- No one can bring someone to Mass unless they are isolating together in the same house.

Reservation System for organizing Mass attendance:

- Parishioners can call the office to reserve the day and time of Mass they want to attend, and include the number of people in the reservation. This is an ongoing reservation and will not change from week-to-week. So, parishioners who make a reservation for Tuesday at 7 a.m. will have that reservation every week. We are accepting phone calls only for reservations.
- Parishioners can have only one reservation at a time.
- Reservations can be made for a weekday or weekend—but not both. If you are retired or have a job situation that allows you to attend Mass during the week, please make a reservation for a weekday so that people who are working have the opportunity to make a reservation for the weekend.
- If you cannot make your reserved time in a given week, contact the office so that we can find a substitute for you. Do not find your own substitute because we will be keeping a waiting list and will use that for substitutes. Your ongoing reservation will stay in place unless you relinquish it. If you want to attend Mass a second time in a week, call the office the day before to see if there is a spot open.
- Please do not show up for Mass without a reservation.
- We will be using a minimum of ministers for Masses to reduce the chance of contamination.
- On the weekend, we will have a cantor (who will also do the readings and the Prayers of the Faithful), and an accompanist. The presider will set up and serve the Mass so we will not be using acolytes or sacristans. Given the small number of people who can attend Mass, we will not need to use extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. This will change as restrictions are lifted over time.
- On weekdays, we will have one lector and the presider who will set up for Mass and do his own altar serving. The presider will distribute Communion. Since there was an existing schedule for daily Mass lectors, that schedule can resume again, if the lectors choose to serve.
- Deacon Steve will coordinate minister schedules.
- Holy Communion will be distributed only under the species of Bread. It is very strongly recommended that you receive Communion only in the hand so as not to put the health of others and the priests in danger.

Exiting After Mass and Other Guidelines:

- We will exit Mass starting with the last pew and maintain strict social distancing as you leave.
- You may exit from the side doors instead of the main doors.
- You are requested to drop off your Offertory in the baskets at the entrance doors on the day you attend Mass. Offertory envelopes will be available next to the basket for those who need them.
- We will be sanitizing the pews, the restrooms, and other frequently touched areas after each Mass.
- Hymnals will not be available for use.
- Eucharistic Adoration will be resumed at a later date.
- All the facilities remain closed to meetings, Bible studies, or other parish activities.





