



From the Pastor



Part 1: Stewardship 2021—

Walking by Faith (2 Cor. 5:7)

The words of St. Paul “We walk by faith and not by sight” have helped to shape the theme of our Stewardship 2021. Living through these strange and unprecedented times, St. Paul’s words have given me a lot of strength.

As we prepare to renew our stewardship commitment in our efforts to become intentional disciples of Christ, I would like to reflect with you on our call to be good stewards. The goal of our lives is holiness, and stewardship is the practical way to get there. So, when we live as good stewards, we are living holy lives. Holiness means being close to the Lord, being close to his church, being close to its mission, open to God’s word and open to the sacraments. Stewardship is not a fundraising technique. Then what is it? It is:

Scripture Based: All of the teachings of stewardship come directly from the Old Testament, the Gospels, and the letters of the New Testament. Stewardship is not a new fad or environmental word. Stewardship is the way God has expected his people to live since the beginning of time.

A Love Response: Once we allow God to truly take up residence in our hearts, we become so overwhelmed by his abundant love for us that we just naturally feel the need to join our lives with his, and dedicate our time, talent, and treasure to carry out God’s work here on earth.

Dependence on God: Stewardship is recognizing that everything we have is a gift from God. We can take credit for nothing. Everything we have and everything we do is a result of some gift that God has placed into our hands.

Giving Back: Stewardship is returning a portion of our gifts to God. The gifts we return are our time, our talent, and our treasure. We return these gifts not because God or our church needs them, but because we feel an overwhelming need to show our love and gratitude to God.

Proportionate Giving: Stewardship calls us to realize that each of us is called to give as God has given to us. We no longer base our giving on what others are giving. Rather, we give in proportion to all that God has given to us.

Trusting in God: Stewardship is trusting God. We believe that our generous God will always provide for us. None of us will ever have all that we want, but we will always have all that we need.

Accountability: Stewardship calls us to recognize that just as in the “Parable of the Talents,” each of us will someday be asked by God to give an accounting of all that we have done with the gifts that have been given to us.

Transformative: Stewardship is transformative. It is making God at the center of our life and all our decision making. Once we embrace the stewardship message, it changes the way we look at every decision we make. God will be first at our every decision making. Stewardship becomes a total way of life and the path to holiness.

In short, stewardship is the path to becoming intentional disciples of Christ. In 1992, the U.S. Catholic Bishops (USCCB) released a pastoral letter on stewardship entitled: *Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response*. I would encourage you to read it to get to know more about stewardship. Show your love and concern for your neighbor by wearing a mask or face shield to church.






