Knowing About Our Own History

The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome: A Sign of Unity and Holiness

The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is a celebration of faith, unity, and identity. It commemorates the first great house of Christian worship in Rome, but more importantly, it proclaims that the true temple of God is His people, built together in love and faith.

Historical Background: The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, celebrated every year on November 9, is one of the oldest liturgical feasts in the Roman Church. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, who is the Pope. For this reason, it is called “Mother and Head of all the Churches of the City and the World” (*Omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput*).

The basilica was originally built in the 4th Century by Emperor Constantine, the first Christian emperor, who donated land and a palace belonging to the Lateran family to Pope Sylvester I around the year 324. It became the first public Christian church in Rome after centuries of persecution. Its dedication marked the recognition of Christianity as a lawful religion in the Roman Empire.

Theological Meaning: The dedication of a church is not only a historical or architectural event—it is a liturgical act that manifests the mystery of the Church as the People of God and the dwelling place of His Spirit.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: “The visible church is a symbol of the dwelling of God among men reconciled and united in Christ” (CCC 1180).

The Lateran Basilica, as the Pope’s cathedral, symbolizes the unity of all local churches with the See of St. Peter, the visible foundation of ecclesial communion. Celebrating its dedication reminds the faithful that the Church is not only made of stones but of living stones, as St. Peter says: “You too, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house” (1 Peter 2:5).

Magisterium Teaching on the Meaning of the Feast: The Second Vatican Council, in *Lumen Gentium*, teaches that the Church is the “temple of the Holy Spirit”, built of men and women who have been made

holy by grace (cf. LG 6). The physical building of a church thus becomes a sign of the spiritual Church—united, consecrated, and mission-oriented.

The Roman Missal explains that the feast of the Lateran Basilica is celebrated throughout the world because it represents the unity of all Christians with the Church of Rome: “As Mother and Head of all the churches, the Lateran Basilica is a visible sign of the communion that unites the particular Churches with the See of Peter.”

Pope Benedict XVI, in a homily for this feast (November 9, 2008), said: “This basilica is the symbol of the love and unity of the universal Church, which finds in the Successor of Peter the visible foundation of its communion.”

Thus, the Magisterium teaches that this feast is not merely Roman but universal: it celebrates the Church’s oneness, holiness, and mission throughout the world.

Spiritual Message for the Faithful: The dedication of the Lateran Basilica invites all Catholics to renew their sense of belonging to the universal Church. It calls us to recognize that we ourselves are temples of God, as St. Paul says, “Do you not know that you are God’s temple and that God’s Spirit dwells in you?” (1 Cor 3:16).

By honoring this sacred building, the Church honors the spiritual temple that God is building in every believer. The feast reminds the faithful to:

- ◆ Remain united with the Pope and the universal Church.
- ◆ Live in holiness, worthy of being God’s dwelling.
- ◆ Work for communion and mission, bringing the light of Christ to the world.

As Pope Francis preached on this feast, “The Church is not made of stones; it is made of us—who receive the Holy Spirit and are called to be a temple of living faith” (*Homily, November 9, 2015*).

Therefore, every November 9th, Catholics throughout the world celebrate not just a building, but the living Church—the Body of Christ—united under the Bishop of Rome, consecrated to God, and sent forth to be His dwelling in the world.
