From the Pastor



The Cry Against Violence in Scripture— Habakkuk 1:2–3; 2:2–4

The prophet Habakkuk opens his book with a raw lament: “How long, O Lord, must I cry for help and you do not listen? Or cry out to you, ‘Violence!’ but you do not intervene? Why do you let me see iniquity? Why do you look at oppression? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and discord abounds” (Hab 1:2–3).

These words echo across the centuries, expressing the anguish of those who witness injustice and brutality in their communities. Later, the Lord responds with a vision: “The vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of faith, shall live” (Hab 2:3–4).

Here, God promises that despite the apparent triumph of violence, justice and fidelity will ultimately prevail. The faithful are called not to despair, but to live by faith and trust in God’s justice.

Catholic Magisterium on Violence—The Catholic Church, through her Magisterium, has consistently condemned violence as contrary to human dignity and the Gospel of peace. A few key teachings illustrate this:

- **Catechism of the Catholic Church** (CCC 2302–2306): The Church affirms that anger and violence are grave offenses against charity. While the defense of justice may sometimes require firmness, the deliberate choice to harm or destroy is incompatible with Christ’s command to love.
- **Gaudium et Spes** (Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, 1965): The Council Fathers lamented the spread of violence in society, noting that “every act of war directed to the indiscriminate destruction of whole cities or vast areas with their inhabitants is a crime against God and man” (GS 80). The same logic applies on a smaller scale: violence tears at the fabric of human fraternity.
- **Evangelii Gaudium** (Pope Francis, 2013): Francis insists that violence is not only physical but also social and structural, rooted in exclusion, poverty, and injustice. He warns that a “throwaway culture” breeds resentment and aggression, which ultimately erupt in harm to others.
- **Fratelli Tutti** (Pope Francis, 2020): The encyclical stresses that violence is never a path to authentic human progress: “Every act of violence committed against a human being is a wound in the flesh of humanity” (FT 227).

Taken together, the Magisterium emphasizes that violence is not only an individual sin but also a social ill that weakens the bonds of community and contradicts the vocation of humanity to communion.

The Ripple Effect of Violence in a Community—When even one or a few members of a community choose violence, the entire community suffers. Catholic social teaching helps us see this ripple effect:

- **Erosion of Trust:** Violence breeds fear. Neighbors begin to view one another with suspicion. Instead of solidarity, mistrust isolates individuals.
- **Cycle of Retaliation:** As the Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church notes, violence tends to reproduce itself in spirals of revenge (CSDC 496). One act of aggression can escalate into cycles of hostility that fracture relationships.
- **Loss of the Common Good:** The Catechism teaches that the common good is the sum of conditions allowing people to reach fulfillment (CCC 1906). Violence undermines this by disrupting safety, cooperation, and mutual support.
- **Scandal to Faith:** In a Christian context, when believers engage in violence, it damages the credibility of the Gospel. Others may ask, like Habakkuk, “Where is God in the midst of this?”
- **Psychological and Spiritual Harm:** Beyond physical damage, violence leaves deep wounds in hearts—trauma, resentment, and despair. Healing requires not only justice but also reconciliation and mercy.

Living by Faith Amid Violence—Habakkuk’s message and the Church’s teaching converge on a hopeful note: “The just one, because of faith, shall live” (Hab 2:4). The Catholic response to violence is not resignation but active witness:

- **Nonviolence as a Way of Life:** Pope Francis, in his 2017 “World Day of Peace” message, proposed Gospel nonviolence as the style of politics and relationships for Christians.
- **Building a Culture of Encounter:** Communities must foster dialogue, forgiveness, and social justice to uproot the causes of violence.
- **Faith as Resistance:** Living by faith means trusting God’s justice, even when violence seems overwhelming. Faithful discipleship resists hatred, choosing love as the stronger force.

Brethren, violence, whether in nations or neighborhoods, is never just a “private problem.” As Habakkuk recognized, violence poisons the whole community, leaving scars of mistrust and despair. The Catholic Magisterium consistently teaches that violence is incompatible with human dignity and divine law. Yet it also reminds us that God’s vision of justice is not defeated by human wrongdoing.

The Church calls every believer to respond not with resignation, but with faith in God’s promise, expressed through works of peace, reconciliation, and the defense of life. As Habakkuk reminds us, “The just one, because of faith, shall live”—and through that faith, communities broken by violence can be healed and renewed.

Keep faithful to our merciful Father. If each one of us takes responsibility for ourselves, together—with the help of God—we can change the world. Would you like to try it as community?
