# From the Pastor



## Justice in the Catholic Church

In Luke 18:1–8, Jesus tells the story of a widow who continually pleads with a judge to grant her justice. The judge, described as neither fearing God nor respecting people, finally gives in—not because he is righteous, but because of her persistence. Jesus then contrasts this corrupt judge with God, who is perfectly just and attentive to His people: “Will not God then secure the rights of His chosen ones who call out to Him day and night?”

### 1. Justice as Faithfulness to God’s Covenant

In Catholic teaching, justice is not merely giving others what is due to them—it is also about right relationship with God and neighbor. The Catechism (CCC 1807) defines justice as “the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to give their due to God and neighbor.”

The widow’s perseverance shows the kind of faith that refuses to give up on God’s justice, trusting that He remains faithful to His promises even when human systems fail.

### 2. God’s Justice vs. Human Injustice

The unjust judge symbolizes worldly power that ignores the poor and vulnerable. In contrast, God’s justice always sides with those who suffer and cry out for mercy. The Church, following Christ, sees justice as defending the dignity of every human person, especially the weak—the widows, orphans, and the poor who so often go unheard.

Catholic social teaching therefore insists that faith must express itself in action: defending life, promoting peace, and ensuring fairness in economic and social systems.

### 3. The Call to Persevering Faith

Jesus ends the parable with a question: “When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?”

Here, justice is tied to faith. Believing in God’s justice means living and acting as though His Kingdom of truth, love, and peace is real. It means not losing heart, even when evil seems to prevail.

### 4. Justice as Prayer in Action

The widow’s persistence is both a model of prayer and a model of justice. Prayer is not passive resignation but a cry for God’s kingdom to break into the world.

The Church teaches that to pray for justice is also to work for it, embodying the Gospel in daily life.



Then, justice in the Catholic Church is:

- ◆ **Faithful perseverance in seeking God’s will.**
- ◆ **Commitment to right relationships with God and neighbor.**
- ◆ **Defense of the poor and vulnerable.**
- ◆ **Active participation in transforming unjust systems.**

Justice is therefore not just a legal or moral concept—it is a sign of faith in the God who hears the cry of His people—and calls the Church to be His instrument of mercy and righteousness in the world.
