



From the Pastor



Historic Church—Part 2

Most of us agree that the “Historic Church is an important piece of Bend’s history, and it needs to be treated as such.”

The stained-glass windows are precious. The lead holding each piece together is wearing out, and it will not be very long before they begin to fail. All the outside glass that protects the stained glass needs replacement as well. They have become very cloudy, and a couple of them fell out last year due to some strong winds. Each window needs to be taken to the studio and worked on—an expensive project—and will cost more than \$400,000 for all of them. There is a naming opportunity here, if you wish to sponsor the restoration of one or more windows.

The renovation plan of the Historic Church includes a new HVAC system. We did have a few instances of people passing out due to the hot temperature conditions inside.

Turning on the fans becomes very noisy, and the traffic noise is a bit too much to open the windows on the Franklin Avenue side. Besides, I am sure those who have been here for a long time would agree that Bend is warmer now than it was 50 or 100 years ago. For many years now, the one thing most requested by attendees was to have air-conditioning.

The focus of every Church is the altar where the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered. That is where Jesus becomes present—body and blood—soul and divinity. Jesus is at the center. As Catholics, Mary and Joseph would come next. The saints who are our models and inspirations in living out the Gospel of Christ come after that.

By now, you will have received the Historic Church renovation campaign information in the mail. If not, please take a copy from the narthex or parish office. And please respond generously.

Building or renovating any worship space is a challenging, but at the same time, an exciting time in the life of a parish. Even the smallest of renovations is an opportunity to renew the liturgical life of the community. The success of a building or renovation project is revealed in its effect on the liturgical life of the community.

“The People of God, which is gathered for Mass is coherently and hierarchically ordered, and this finds its expression in the variety of ministries and the variety of actions according to the different parts of the celebration. Hence, the general arrangement of the sacred building must be such that in some way it conveys the image of the assembled congregation and allows the appropriate ordering of all the participants, as well as facilitating each in the proper carrying out of his function” (GIRM 294).

Building or renovation of a Church should also be an opportunity to renew our faith. The renovation that we are talking about is a huge opportunity to deepen our faith and show its beauty and depth. It needs to lead us to a spiritual renewal. It needs to be faith centered and not building centered.

“A church building participates in the sanctifying and redeeming action of God in the sacramental liturgy.”

A Catholic church is a structure that symbolizes and embodies the presence of God in the local assembly. Every church project—whether building or renovation—is, therefore, an expression of the faith and vibrancy of the community. Please remember all our efforts in your daily prayer.

“Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain” (Psalm 127:1).
