



From the Pastor



Go and Repair My House

Francis of Assisi heard the Lord's call as he knelt beneath a large wooden crucifix in San Damiano, "Francis, Francis go and repair my house which, as you can see, is falling into ruins."

Taking that command very literally, Francis set about physically rebuilding the little church—stone by stone. He did the same with other abandoned churches in the area, having gone about begging for help to complete his work. Only later did he understand the call in a broader sense, which we will reflect on for our annual stewardship campaign.

Today, I write to ask your help to repair the Lord's house in the way St. Francis understood it first—a physical building—the Historic Church.

After the debt on the 27th Street Church was paid off, I included the renovation of the Historic Church as part of my Vision 2025. I then formed a committee of people with a variety of skillsets to lead the restoration and renovation efforts. As per their recommendations in 2019, we replaced the much-needed sidewalks at the front of the church with the addition of a radiant heat, snow-melt system, under the sidewalks and replaced the failing wall in 2020. This has greatly improved the appearance and safety in front of the church.

The Historic Church Restoration and Renovation Committee (HCRRC) also met with Daprato Rigali Studios, a company that specializes in interior design, renovation and restoration of historic Catholic churches. It was Daprato Rigali Studios that designed, fabricated and installed the beautiful back altar piece in our Historic Church over one hundred years ago.

After the company presented us with a stunning design for the total renovation, costing

about \$2.5 million, we did a survey among the parishioners to get your input.

After evaluating the architect's proposal and the parish survey, we held a meeting and decided to move forward on a \$1.5 million project that includes the renovation of the sanctuary and the stained-glass windows. This does not include any renovation in the nave—the central part of the church—except for the stained-glass windows.

The brochure that you will be receiving in the mail will give you the details of the renovation that we intend to do. A critical question to ask is, "Why do this?"

The Historic Church is a beacon of hope and the visible landmark of the presence of the Catholic faith in Bend. It has been 100 years since that church was built, and we want to make sure that it remains an attractive "lighthouse" that witnesses to the beauty of the Catholic faith for many more years to come, bringing people to Christ, offering them hope and eternal salvation.

When you receive the packet in the mail, please pray and respond as generously as you can. There are a number of sponsorship opportunities available, and pledges can be made over three years. We will not start the project until we have 70 percent of the cost of the project (approximately \$1 million) in hand. With some generous support and with the Finance Council committing \$200,000 from the Capital Repairs Fund, the Historic Church Restoration and Renovation Fund now has \$500,000, leaving only \$500,000 left to raise before we can begin the work.

May God bless your sacrifices to renovate and restore His house, and may St. Francis intercede for us. Thank you for your love and support to St. Francis Parish.



Franciscans Are a Big Family!

Most people are familiar with St. Francis of Assisi and know stories about “the little poor man” after whom our parish is named.

And many people know of the Franciscan Friars, including the priests who founded our parish, as well as Franciscan sisters, or nuns.

But did you know that St. Francis also founded an order for lay people? At the time he was alive in Assisi, in the 12th and 13th centuries, there were people who were attracted to Francis and his group of Brothers, but who were unable to join them because they were married, or for other reasons chose not to become a priest or a nun. Francis welcomed these people and founded an order just for them—the Secular Franciscan Order. “Secular” means lay.

“St. Francis is known as everyone’s saint!”

A Way of Life

The Franciscan lifestyle is based on the simplicity of Gospel living with a deep and mature trust in the Spirit of God. St. Francis called the Holy Spirit the “Minister General” of the Order. He considered having the Holy Spirit active in one’s life to be the most important thing.



The Secular Franciscan Order (SFO) is an official Order within the Catholic Church. Members do not live in community but live their everyday lives in the world. However, members gather together in fraternity on a regular basis. By profession, they promise to follow a Rule of Life

approved and confirmed by Pope Paul VI in June of 1978.

In these fraternities the brothers and sisters, led by the Spirit, strive for perfect charity in their own secular state. At their profession, they pledge themselves to live the Gospel in the manner of St. Francis by means of this rule approved by the Church.

Over the span of its long history, the SFO has been a blessing within the Church. There are 17,000 Secular Franciscans in the USA. And some of these Secular Franciscans are right here in Central Oregon!

We gather monthly to pray together, to learn together, to do good works, to socialize, and to follow in the footsteps of Jesus!


This ministry is open to all who like to knit or crochet prayer shawls for parishioners/friends who need this comfort because we care and want to wrap those who need them in prayers.

School Custodian Position

St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School seeks to hire one or two individuals to provide custodial service for the school year 2021–2022. The school custodian is responsible for the cleanliness of the entire school building: classrooms, library, administrative areas, and restrooms.

- Duties: Vacuuming, mopping; cleaning restrooms, windows, mirrors; and collecting trash.
- Hours: 23 hours per week, divided among Monday through Friday—can be performed by one person or a team of two who split the hours between them. (For example, a team of two may complete the work in 11½ hours.)
- Compensation: \$14/hour per person—can be applied toward student tuition.


What is a Tribunal?

The Office of Canonical Affairs and Matrimonial Tribunal is one Office of the Chancery of the Diocese of Baker. Its staff members are appointed by Bishop Cary and have received special training to represent him and the Church in judicial proceedings for marriage cases and matters of Canon law.

Most of its work involves assisting divorced people who are interested in proving the nullity of a prior marriage bond, allowing them to remarry in the Church.

really enjoys the opportunities that our St. Francis School provides.


The main focus in Social Studies during Middle School is Critical Thinking, which will serve them well throughout their educational career.






