From the Pastor



Talking About Courage

The Apostle Paul’s letter to Timothy (2 Timothy 1:6–8, 13–14) contains a strong exhortation toward courage, loyalty, and faithful stewardship of the Christian message. Key ideas in these verses include:

- ♦ **Fan into flame the gift of God** (v. 6): The gifts (spiritual gifts, calling, etc.) that God gives are not meant to lie dormant. They are to be stirred up, cultivated.
- ♦ **Spirit not of fear but of power, love, and self-discipline** (v. 7): Paul insists that God has given a spirit that does *not* shrink from hardship or opposition, but one that equips believers to act with strength, compassion, and wisdom.
- ♦ **Do not be ashamed** (v. 8): Specifically, Paul tells Timothy to not be ashamed of the testimony of Christ nor of Paul (his mentor/apostle imprisoned), and to be willing to share in suffering for the gospel by God’s power.
- ♦ **Guard the good deposit** (v. 13–14): The entrusted truth of the gospel is to be preserved, protected, held firm, not corrupted, and safeguarded by the Holy Spirit.

Given the scripture and what we know of Kirk’s public Christian identity, “not being ashamed” in his life might have meant:

- ♦ Consistently speaking the gospel—even when it is unpopular, especially when it conflicts with prevailing cultural norms.
- ♦ Embracing criticism or opposition as part of the Christian journey rather than retreating, compromising, or changing tone out of fear.
- ♦ Ensuring that the Christian message is not reduced to mere moralism, culture war, or political ideology detached from the core of Christ’s message (love, repentance, grace).
- ♦ Maintaining personal integrity—life, actions, speech should reflect Christian values (humility, honesty, compassion).

- ♦ Guarding what is essential in the gospel: the death and resurrection of Jesus, repentance and faith, transformation of life—not letting peripheral or political issues replace or overshadow these essentials.

From both the scripture and observing public Christian figures like Charlie Kirk, one might draw these broader lessons:

- ♦ **Cultivate courage through spiritual disciplines**
As Paul tells Timothy to “fan into flame” the gift—this implies ongoing work: prayer, Scripture, fellowship, teaching. Christian courage is not automatic; it’s nurtured.
- ♦ **Remember the source of boldness**
Paul emphasizes that it is “by the power of God” that one can do this. It is not human strength alone. Relying on God—not one’s own reputation or strategy—is crucial.
- ♦ **Be ready to endure hardship**
The road may bring shame, misunderstanding, opposition, and loss. Yet scripture expects that followers of Christ will sometimes suffer. Accepting that possibility without being ashamed is part of faithful witness.
- ♦ **Guard the core message**
It’s easy for Christian identity in the public square to become tied up with cultural or political issues. Guarding the “good deposit” means distinguishing what is essential to the gospel from what is important but secondary—and not allowing the secondary to corrupt the primary.
- ♦ **Pursue unity, humility, and love**
Boldness does not have to become harshness. The scripture speaks of power, love, self-discipline. They go together. Christian boldness without love can harm witness. Christian speech without humility can alienate.

This passage calls Christians to bold faith, enduring suffering, preserving gospel integrity, and living in confidence of their calling and God’s enabling power.
