From the

Catholic Education—Part 4

Continuing my reflection on the importance of a Catholic education, one of the more challenging findings of the CARA study commissioned by St. Mary's Press, "Going, Going, Gone: The Dynamics of Disaffiliation in Young Catholics," is this observation: "The authors of the CARA study do not perceive any significant way for the Church to attract many who have left to return to the faith. While historically some do return, often as they age or because of a 'life-cycle effect,' there seems to be a difference in the millennial generation, particularly with respect to the idea of not wanting to force religion on their own children. That suggests that this life-cycle effect may no longer be true" (p. 32).

There are many things that parents force onto their children—like what to eat, who to play with, when and how long to play, what toys to have, where to go, what chores to do, what to school to attend, what medicine to take, etc.—which are part of parenting. But when it comes to religion and faith, they prefer to stay out of it.

Younger parents—"millennials"—don't come back. It used to be that when young adults had children, they often returned to the practice of the faith and the habit of Sunday Mass. But the most recent findings suggest that—today—young parents do not necessarily return to the practice of their faith once they have children. Therefore, Catholic schools reach out to evangelize, not only the child, but also the parents. The mission of Christ has Catholic schools in order to bring our parents back to Him. Catholic schools do not exist simply for the economic and social well-being of our students, or even of our larger society.

Yes! We can and should be proud of the academic and social achievements of our graduates. But we also must remember that these achievements mean nothing if the child and the parents are not brought closer to Christ—and closer to the commitment they made at the baptism of their children.

Our schools are communities of faith, where our faith is lived and professed and talked about. Just think of how difficult it would be to educate and form

children if you could make no real reference to God or to Jesus who came to save them, loves them, gave His life for them, forgives their sins, and redeems them!

Just think of how difficult it would be if you could not tell children that Jesus walks with them, knows them, loves them, and so much more!

I have seen children and parents, who were not Catholic, come to the faith just by being in a Catholic school. Children are powerful agents to evangelize their family—especially the parents.

Catholic schools build up the life of the parish—life, energy, and commitment. The parents get involved, do things, and often carry the parish forward. They are often the first ones there and the last to go. They oversee the Auction, the Carnival, the Family Night, and so much more.

In Catholic schools you have the opportunity to impact and form—not just the lives of the children—but of the parents and families as well.

If a School Pastor has a heart attack, no one would be surprised. Everyone knows he works too hard and thus he is more susceptible to a heart attack! But, at least, it will be a heart attack worth having! He works in ways that most parishioners have no clue.

There is also a very high percentage of Pastors, Principals, and Teachers who are products of Catholic schools.

Catholic schools are very important and essential to the life of the Church—and to the life of society. Today, we can hardly imagine the United States landscape without Catholic schools. A Catholic Education is an investment in eternity. Your new car will be old in a year. The child you educate in a Catholic school is immortal. This education will never have to be replaced. It will last forever. The school that you help to educate that child is in business with God for that child.

So, as a Catholic School, we are in business with God for your children. It's an investment that you'll never regret. May God reward your generosity and your goodness!

Pray-4-Life Ontario Pilgrimage / Vigil

As **Bishop Cary** revealed in his audio message a few weeks ago, he is initiating the “Pray-4-Life” Pilgrimage/Vigil at the new Ontario Planned Parenthood, in support of the Ontario community and the Blessed Sacrament Parish, in their struggle to close the new Planned Parenthood facility there.

This weekend, you are invited to register at the back of the narthex after all Masses to participate in this Pilgrimage / Prayer Vigil. Our Parish dates are: Wednesday, October 25th, and Thursday, October 26th.

In the Bulletin last weekend, the schedule in Ontario was published. Here it is again:

- **Depart Bend for Ontario on Wednesday, October 25th, at 7 a.m.: Stand our Vigil time at Planned Parenthood, which starts with a blessing at Blessed Sacrament Parish at 3:30 p.m.**
- **Then on to the Vigil from 4 to 5 p.m.**
- **Dinner / Overnight Lodging**
- **Thursday, October 26th, at 8 a.m.: At Blessed Sacrament for the 8:30 a.m. blessing at Mass.**
- **Grab something to eat, and then on to the Vigil at Planned Parenthood from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m.**
- **Depart Ontario for Bend**

When you register, you will be given all the information needed in regard to Vigil/Mass times, as well as discount lodging and RV park information. Blessed Sacrament is supporting any pilgrims from out of town with meals, providing banners, signs, flags, and T-shirts to purchase.

Because Ontario is 5–6 hours distant from Bend, and 1 hour ahead in time, the overnight option was chosen in hopes that parishioners would attempt to carpool there and back.
