P From the Pastor



Let Us Pray for One Another

The First Letter to Timothy (2:1–8) reminds us of one of the most essential responsibilities we carry as a Christian community: the call to intercede for one another in prayer. St. Paul writes, “I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone. . . . This is good and pleasing to God, our Savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.”

At the heart of this passage is the conviction that our prayer is not simply about “me and God.” The Christian life is never individualistic. From the moment of baptism, we are grafted into the Body of Christ. We belong to one another. And because we belong to one another, we pray for each other.

The Universal Scope of Intercession

Paul emphasizes that prayers are to be made for everyone—not just for those we love, not only for our fellow Catholics—but even for rulers, leaders, and those with whom we may disagree. This is challenging. It stretches our hearts beyond narrow boundaries.

In a divided world, our intercessory prayer becomes a way of healing divisions. By lifting others up before God—even those who hurt us—we allow grace to soften resentment and replace hostility with mercy.

Intercession as Participation in Christ’s Mission

St. Paul reminds us that there is “one mediator between God and humanity—Christ Jesus.”

Our intercession is not separate from Christ but united with His eternal prayer before the Father. Every time we intercede, we are joining Christ’s priestly mission, making His mercy visible in our community.

Think of the Mass: during the *Prayers of the Faithful*, the Church teaches us to remember the

needs of the world—the leaders, the poor, the sick, the deceased—because in the Eucharist, all are gathered into Christ’s redeeming sacrifice.

Building a Community of Love

When we pray for each other, we strengthen the bonds of love. Imagine a parish where no one is forgotten in prayer: the sick know they are supported, the grieving know they are not alone, leaders are guided by grace, and even the absentees are remembered. Such prayer transforms a parish into a true family of faith.

Praying for one another is not just a pious duty; it is a form of service. We may not always have money to give or time to spare, but we can always lift others up to God. This hidden ministry of intercession sustains the Church more than we realize.

A Call to Action

St. Paul concludes with the image of lifting “holy hands without anger or argument.” In other words, prayer must flow from a reconciled heart. If we carry bitterness, our intercession loses credibility. Before we can pray for others, we must allow Christ to heal what is broken within us.

So, let us ask: Do we truly pray for each other? For our parish, for our leaders, for those who suffer? Or do our prayers circle only around our personal needs? Today, the Word of God calls us to widen our prayer, to intercede as a people united in Christ.

Brothers and sisters, may our parish become a community marked by intercessory love. Let us carry each other to the Father in prayer, through Christ the one Mediator, in the power of the Holy Spirit. Specially, for the eternal repose of Charlie Kirk and his family. May our prayers, like incense rising before God, bring healing, unity, and hope to the Church and the world.
