

From the Pastor

Lent is here . . .

We have just begun the season of Lent with the observance of Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. It has been two years since the outbreak of the Corona virus pandemic. Church doors had to close initially and move to online streaming. We continue to stream Masses still today for the sake of those who are unable to join us in person and for the sick and homebound who cannot get to Mass. We are very grateful that we can gather together again to celebrate the holy Eucharist and other sacraments. We thank God that restrictions are being rolled back and State mask mandates for all indoor activities will end on March 12th. We keep up our prayers for a return of ALL to Church. We live—not by fear—but by faith.

Lent is a journey accompanying Jesus into the desert fasting, praying and almsgiving. The desert is not anything new to us, as we live pretty much in a desert. The desert gives the least distraction and helps us to focus on God. Remember to find some extra time for prayer and penance during this season to focus on what this season is all about. Try going to a weekday Mass, Eucharistic adoration, Stations of the Cross, reading the scripture daily or spending some time in personal prayer. Do not neglect fasting. It could be fasting from food and drinks and from excessive use of material things, and fasting from some stubborn habits that you may have grown into during the year. Lenten reflection materials like *The Word Among Us* and the link in the weekly email for daily reflections are provided for your use.

Have a special jar on your dining table this season of Lent to put in your savings from the sacrifices you make every day of Lent and, then when Easter comes, give the savings for the benefit of the needy.

We will have our Lenten Mission March 7th through March 10th, starting at 6:30 p.m. in English and at 8 p.m. in Spanish preached by Fr. Roemer, a priest of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. He will give a shorter version of the talk daily after the 12:15 p.m. daily Mass on each of those mission days. You do not want to miss out on these days of special blessings!


The theme of Lenten observance for us this year is “Repent and Believe.” The most important thing anyone can do for Lent is to “Return to the Lord with your whole heart” (Joel 2:12). That is the root meaning of repent: to turn around. Catholics have traditionally expressed sorrow for sin and the desire to live as genuine Disciples of Christ through the three traditional Lenten disciplines of fasting, almsgiving and prayer. These Lenten disciplines will prepare you to receive the grace of Easter. These disciplines are aimed at purifying and transforming our lives to help us rise with Christ to the challenges of self-giving love.

Fasting is the most powerful spiritual discipline of all Christian disciplines. Through fasting and prayer, the Holy Spirit can transform your lives. Fasting helps us spiritually and physically. However, fasting is one of the most neglected spiritual practices today. Yet, it is the most effective means to get rid of our stubborn evil inclinations, obsessions and bad habits. It is a great tool to self-discipline. Jesus Himself fasted and taught His disciples about fasting.

Fasting is a time when we abstain from food or other pleasures, and take the time to focus on God. Denying something physical to glorify God, and enter into a deeper relationship with Him is the spirit of fasting. It is a way to demonstrate that we are serious about our relationship with God and that He comes first.

The Church requires us to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Anyone over the age of 18, but under the age of 60, should eat only one full meal on those two days. The Church also invites us to practice abstinence. That means anyone 14 years or older must abstain from meat on all Fridays. The USCCB allows the substitution of some other forms of penance for abstinence on all of the Fridays of the year, except the Fridays in Lent.

I pray for a grace-filled Lenten journey. See you at the Lenten Mission starting this Monday.



All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from meat and poultry on
Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

Fr. Roemer will also preside at the **12:15 p.m. Masses on March 7th through 10th**, and he will give a shortened version of his Mission Message for that night.


About Fr. Roemer

Fr. Richard Roemer has been a member of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal since 1990. Ordained in 1998, he has served his congregation and the Church in a variety of services for the poor, works of evangelization and formation.

He guided the opening of a friary in London in 2000 and then served in the formation of young friars in New York and New Jersey for 7 years.

He helped to initiate ministries such as the St. Francis Center for Youth in the Bronx, the St. Joseph's Soup Kitchen in Harlem, and the St. Anthony Shelter for Renewal for homeless men in the Bronx.

He served 3 terms as Vicar General of the CFRs, and he is currently serving in Comayagua, Honduras, directing the formation of postulants from Central and South America. He also enjoys preaching retreats and missions and accompanying people in spiritual direction.






St. Clare's Helpers



The Potluck Party begins at 11:30 a.m.—with lunch at noon.




New Rectory "Gift Cards"
