





From the Pastor



St. Joseph: The Model of Workers—Part 1

The Catholic Church officially celebrates St. Joseph twice in the liturgical year. March 19th commemorates his vocation as the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and May 1st his vocation as a worker and provider.

St. Joseph's most obvious mark in salvation history was his role as foster father to Jesus and husband to Mary. In this vocation he served those he loved with all his heart and strength. But, it is also his humility and loving diligence as a hard-working provider that serves as an example to all who work to fulfill a vocation or provide for a family. This month we reflect on *St. Joseph: The Model of Workers*.

The Feast of St. Joseph, the Worker, was inaugurated by Pope Pius XII, who announced it on May 1, 1955 in an audience with Italian workers. To them he described St. Joseph as “the humble craftsman of Nazareth” who “not only personifies the dignity of the manual laborer with God and the Holy Church,” but is “also always the provident custodian of you and your families.”

Pius XII encouraged continued religious formation for adult workers and said it was an “atrocious slander” to charge that the Church is “an ally of capitalism against the workers.”

“She, mother and teacher of all, is always particularly solicitous for her children who find themselves in the most difficult conditions, and also in fact has validly contributed to the achievement of honest progress already achieved by various categories of workers,” the pope continued.

While the Church has rejected various systems of Marxist socialism, Pius XII said, no priest or Christian can remain deaf to a cry for justice and a spirit of brotherhood. Pope Pius XII declared the feast day of St. Joseph, the Worker, as a response to the increasingly communist climate of the time. It served as a reminder to the faithful of the true

dignity and value of work for human beings, and the role of our labor in sanctifying us and in glorifying God with St. Joseph as our model.

Mass unemployment is a deeply unwelcome background for this year's Feast of St. Joseph, the Worker, but the Catholic celebration has lessons for everyone, regardless of job situation.

Citing the Holy Family's escape to Egypt, Fr. Donald Calloway says that St. Joseph is “very empathetic toward those suffering unemployment because he, himself, at some point would have been unemployed in the Flight to Egypt. They had to pack up everything, and go to a foreign country with nothing. They didn't plan on that.

“For those who are unemployed, St. Joseph gives us a model of not allowing the difficulties of life to crush one's spirit but, rather, trusting in God's providence, and in adding to that providence our own attitude and strong work ethic.”

St Joseph gave dignity to work, “Because, as the one chosen to be the earthly father of Jesus, he taught the Son of God to do manual labor,” said Calloway. “He was entrusted with teaching the Son of God a trade, to be a carpenter.

“However, neither Jesus nor St. Joseph were workaholics. Workaholics are of no benefit to themselves, the family, or society. God does not delight in a workaholic.

“We're not called to be slaves to a trade, or to find our ultimate meaning of life in our work, but to allow our work to glorify God, to build up the human community, to be a source of joy to everyone,” Calloway continued. “The fruit of your labor is meant to be enjoyed by yourself and others, but not at the expense of harming others or depriving them of a just wage or overworking them, or having working conditions that are beyond human dignity.”

These people are our children or our parents, friends, neighbors, or they may be strangers. Additionally, they are our brothers and sisters in the Bend community.


Your action gives hope to a population often marginalized and left ignored in the shadows. You give strength to us all.

The Saint Francis Middle School Track Team participated in a Virtual Track Season. Practices were held on the School Campus, and two 6–8 Grade intra-squad meets were held at Pilot Butte Middle School. The St. Francis Team was able to train and compete in the following events: 4 x 100 relay and meter races, including the 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m, 1500m, Shot Put, and Discus. After each meet, the results were entered into [Athletic.net](#), and they were compared to the other competing Middle School teams in the Bend/LaPine School District. Although this was not a normal Track Season, the athletes were able to experience team camaraderie while focusing on exercising to improve scores. All coaches are very proud of both the dedication and perseverance each student athlete demonstrated.

There were many exciting races this season that pushed runners to reach new personal limits. A few races to highlight from this season included the exciting and tough 1500-meter and the fast-paced 400-meter and 200-meter races. The 1500-meter athletes included **Rafael Maloney, Gavin Tate, Madeline Lorenz, Zoey Denning, and Sydney Alvarado**. These athletes trained hard by running miles and practicing speed training. Another race to highlight is the always exciting—and last race of the evening—the 400-meter race! This is no easy event, as athletes run only one lap at their fastest pace. This race had many athletes including our eighth-grade runners, **Tayten Wigle and Anna Hernandez**; seventh-grade runners, **Alden Franceschina, Ellie Norris, Jojo Daniels, Rylee Smith**; and sixth-grade runners **Danielle Morgen and Mallory Towell**. Eighth-grader, **Danielle Davis**, seventh-grader, **Alexa Sanchez**, and sixth-grader, **Estrella Ramirez** all achieved some very promising times in the 200-meter race.

The throwers also did a fantastic job! This was their first experience where technique is crucial. They trained hard to refine their technique and achieve personal growth. Throwers include: **Aiden Towell, Anson Fleck, Kiya Young, Breanna Fessler, Grace McCance, Nicolas Martin, Aaron Roscher, and Christopher Turel**. The St. Francis Coaches, **Mr. Woodworth, Mrs. Boswell, and Miss Pakalnis**, are very proud of each and every athlete trying something new, dedicating the time to work toward their best, and being resilient in a unique Track Season. Coaches and athletes also want to thank parents who dedicated their time to help with the meets and to balance a new schedule.
