






Building the Domestic Church— the Family—During This Pandemic

While public Masses are suspended, the activities that are normally part of our local parish are gone. But Jesus' call for us as Christian families—to serve as domestic churches in teaching the faith, growing in virtue, and evangelization—still exists. By following the five steps below, you can become true leaders of your domestic churches.

1. Start and end the day in prayer

Every good thing starts and ends in prayer. That is why the heads of the households should start every morning leading their families in prayer and end every night in the same way. Because of our special devotion to Mary, they should also regularly lead their families in praying the rosary together.

2. Schedule time together, as a family

Quality time spent together as a family is essential to a strong domestic church. But, these days, with so much time spent inside under the “shelter-in-place” orders, it's easy to mistake time *near* each other with time *with* each other. You could be under the same roof, but each could be in his or her own world. That's why it's important to plan time together as a family—a family dinner, for example, is an excellent start. Consider also planning a family activity, a movie night, or a weekday family Mass over the live-stream from St. Francis! There are lots of Catholic resources also available on FORMED.org. Use the parish code **ZCBRWF** to set up a free account for yourself and enjoy what it has to offer.

3. Keep holy reminders

There are a lot of mundane tasks that occur in our homes—but even during chores, schoolwork or working from home, we are called to bring our faith into everything we do. One easy way to make sure we don't forget God and prayer in our daily lives is to keep a “holy reminder” in sight. Whether a prayer card, an image of the Blessed Mother or a cross, these objects serve as a reminder to refocus on our Lord and keep a spirit of prayer throughout the day.

4. Make an act of charity

There's a lot that our families are sacrificing right now, but these sacrifices have the power to help those in need. Invite your family to come together and decide how to use funds you would otherwise use on going to the movies, eating at a restaurant or other events restricted by social distancing. If you have the means, consider using these funds to support your local parish, contributing to St. Vincent de Paul or another charity.

5. Lead in hope

Faith without hope is sure to be short-lived and, in this time of uncertainty and loss, it can be easy to fall into hopelessness. As a Catholic family, we are called to remember the hope offered us by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ—especially in this Easter season. As the head of your domestic church, you are constantly called to share this hope of faith with your family.







Dear St. Francis of Assisi Community,

“Behold, I bring you tidings of great joy!” (Lk 1:10). I am writing to share the good news that Bishop Cary has announced that we will be re-instituting public celebrations of the Eucharist once again, limited to 25 people in attendance, effective Monday, May 11th. While this is not the total re-opening that we all want, it is a beginning. Social distancing is still required.

In order to make sure that as many parishioners as possible can attend Mass, we have developed the attached procedures and guidelines. Please read them over. Bishop Cary has extended the dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation that he put in place earlier. While no one is obliged to attend Mass, we want to open the opportunity to attend Mass to as many people as possible. These procedures will be changed from time-to-time as the State lifts restrictions. We will continue live-streaming all Masses.

We should remember a couple of general principles. Vulnerable, at-risk, and concerned persons are encouraged to remain at home. Use of face masks or coverings by the faithful is encouraged. Anyone with the slightest symptoms or feelings of sickness must remain home.

Funerals, weddings, and baptisms can be celebrated as long as the attendance, including ministers and musicians, does not exceed 25. Confessions will continue to be heard on Saturdays at 3 p.m., as we have been doing. In addition, Confessions will be heard after the Tuesday 7 a.m. Mass and the Saturday 8 a.m. Mass, using our new procedure. The Historic Church will still be open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., 7-days a week. You must input the access code, 0494*, in order to open the door.

We are looking at ways to schedule First Communion and Confirmation, but we may have to wait until we can have more people present at Mass. Confirmation is also contingent on the Bishop’s schedule.

Fr. Steve, Deacon Steve and I appreciate all the notes of support that we have received over the past month. They encourage us in our ministries.

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the parish office. We look forward to the time when we can gather again as normal.

ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

- All Masses will be celebrated in the 27th Street Church.
- Limit: 25 people per Mass including the presider and any other ministers.
- Weekend Mass Schedule:
 - Saturday: 5 p.m.
 - 7 p.m. (Spanish)
 - Sunday: 7:30 a.m., 10 a.m. & 4:30 p.m.
 - 12:30 p.m. (Spanish)
- Daily Mass Schedule: 7 a.m. & 12: 15 p.m. (Monday–Friday) & 8 a.m. (Saturday)
- Seating
 - We have blocked off the pews that are not available for seating.
 - We will strictly observe social distancing guidelines, which include no exchange of peace during Mass, and no handshaking before and after Mass.
 - People who are isolating together in the same household may attend Mass together and sit together without the 6' distancing requirement. However, there must be 6' between that family unit and the next nearest person.
 - No one can bring someone to Mass unless they are isolating together in the same house.
- Reservation System: We are instituting the following reservation system for organizing Mass attendance:
 - Starting Monday, May 4th, parishioners can call the office to reserve the day and time of Mass that they want to attend, and include the number of people in the reservation. This is an ongoing reservation and will not change from week-to-week. So, parishioners who make a reservation for Tuesday at 7 a.m. will have that reservation every week. We are accepting phone calls only for reservations.
 - Parishioners can have only one reservation at a time.
 - Reservations can be made for a weekday or weekend—but not both. If you are retired or have a job situation that allows you to attend Mass during the week, please make a reservation for a weekday so that people who are working have the opportunity to make a reservation for the weekend.
 - If you cannot make your reserved time in a given week, contact the office so that we can find a substitute for you. Do not find your own substitute because we will be keeping a waiting list and will use that for substitutes. Your ongoing reservation will stay in place unless you relinquish it. If you want to attend Mass a second time in a week, call the office the day before to see if there is a spot open.
 - Please do not show up for Mass without a reservation.



- We will be using a minimum of ministers for Masses to reduce the chance of contamination.
 - On the weekend, we will have a cantor (who will also do the readings and the Prayers of the Faithful), and an accompanist. The presider will set up and serve the Mass so we will not be using acolytes or sacristans. Given the small number of people who can attend Mass, we will not need to use extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. This will change as restrictions are lifted over time.
 - On weekdays, we will have one lector and the presider who will set up for Mass and do his own altar serving. The presider will distribute Communion. Since there was an existing schedule for daily Mass lectors, that schedule can resume again, if the lectors choose to serve.
 - Deacon Steve will coordinate minister schedules.
- Holy Communion will be distributed only under the species of Bread. It is very strongly recommended that you receive Communion only in the hand so as not to put the health of others and the priests in danger.
- Exiting After Mass
 - We will exit Mass starting with the last pew.
 - Maintain strict social distancing as you leave.
 - You may exit from the side doors instead of the main doors.
- You are requested to drop off your Offertory in the baskets at the door as you walk into the Church on the day you attend Mass. Offertory envelopes will be available next to the basket for those who need them.
- We will be sanitizing the pews, the restrooms and other frequently touched spots after each Mass.
- Hymnals will not be available for use.
- Eucharistic Adoration will be resumed at a later date.
- All the facilities remain closed to meetings, Bible studies, or other parish activities.
